In addition, the Sheriff advised that there was a small fishing pond on this property. Sheriff STOCKARD advised that he had excellent informant coverage in this Unit during the years it was in operation and at no time did he ever possess any knowledge of a murder taking place at the Klavern Hall or in any way connected with the Graham Klavern. In addition, Sheriff STOCKARD advised that the Graham Unit ceased to exist in approximately 1972-1973 and certainly was not in existance in 1975.
