MINORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: Flying Saucers Problem

- 1. At an informal discussion between DD/I, AD/IC, and Acting AD/SI, it was agreed that the saucer problem should be attacked by getting together the responsible individuals in the community to work out a program of research and intelligence which can then be implemented by then directly. The agreed program can then be forwarded to the DOI and possibly the Secretary of Defense and the balance of the National Security Council as an established program rather than maiting for a great deal of formal, high level paper pushing before taking action.
- DD/I directed acting AD/SI to contact Dr. Whitman and Cen. Sanford to arrange an appropriate time at which this problem can be reviewed. Acting AD SI to call on Dr. Whitean and review the background of our study before the neeting.
