

## REPORT OF THE SCIENTIFIC PARSE ON UNICESTIFIED FIXED CAJECTS

17 January 1953

- 1. The undersigned Famel of Scientific Commutants has not at the request of the Government to avaluate any possible threat to national security posed by Unidentified Flying Unjotes ("Flying Saucers"), and to make recommendation. The Pauel has received the evidence as presented by cognizant Governmental agments, primarily the United States Air Forms, and has reviewed a selection of the best documented incidents.
  - 2. As a result of its ecosiderations, the Panel soncludes:

That the evidence presented on Unidentified Flying Chjects shows no indication that these phenomena constitute a direct physical threat to pational security.

We firmly believe that there is no residuum of cases which indicates phenomena which are stributable to foreign artifacts capable of hostile acts, and that there is no evidence that the phenomena indicate a need for the revision of current scientific concepts.

3. In the light of this conclusion, the Pencl recommends:

That the national security agencies take immediate steps to strip the Unidentified Flying Chiects of the special status they have been given and the sums of mystemy they have unfortunately acquired.

We suggest that this aim may be achieved by an integrated program designed to resoure the public of the total lock of evidence of inimical forces behind the phononers.
