Dear Mr. Greenwald,

This responds to your 22 June 2016 Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request (Enclosure 1) to the National Security Agency (NSA) for a copy of the Intellipedia entry for Operation Looking Glass and/or Project Looking Glass.

The NSA forwarded two documents to the Office of the Director of National Intelligence (ODNI) for our review and direct response to you. Upon thorough review, we have determined that the document can be released to you in segregable form (Enclosure 2).

Information was redacted pursuant to FOIA exemption (b)(3), which applies to information exempt by statute, specifically 50 U.S.C. § 3024(m)(1), which protects information pertaining to the names and other identifying information of ODNI employees.


If you wish to appeal our determination on this request, please explain the basis of your appeal and forward to: Office of the Director of National Intelligence, Information Management Division, Washington, DC 20511, within 90 days of the date of this letter.

Looking Glass, also known as **Project Looking Glass (PLG)**, is a tabletop Intelligence Community exercise methodology, developed by the Intelligence Technology Innovation Center (ITIC), that complements traditional military war gaming. PLG uses red, blue, and white teams, with red equating to adversarial, blue to friendly, and white to available intelligence assets and resources. Over the past two years PLG has held nine exercises, each of which has examined different, but related, hypotheses.^[1]

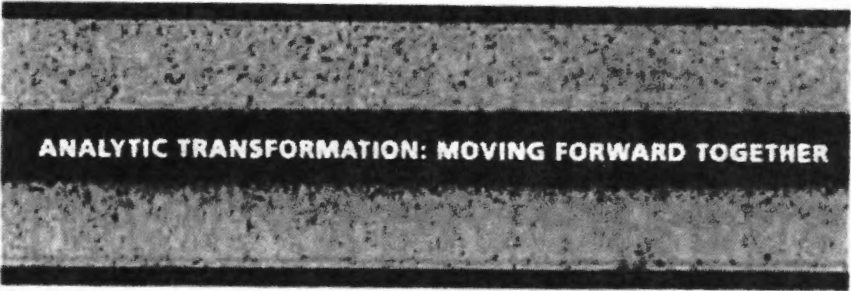
