RE: Highway Safety Action Plan

Dear Mr. Mitchell,

At a meeting of the Ouachita Council of Governments (OCOG) on July 25, 2022, I presented information regarding Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) grants to the Transportation Policy Committee. Members of the committee requested I provide additional information regarding the SS4A grants program as well as a cost estimate for creating an Action Plan for Ouachita Parish which includes rural Ouachita Parish, the City of Monroe, and the City of West Monroe. In response to this request, the following is provided.

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) recently established the new Safe Streets and Roads for All discretionary federal grant program. The program provides \$1 billion of federal funds annually over the next 5 years with a total appropriation of \$5 billion. The goal of the SS4A program is to reduce and prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries. MPO's, parishes, cities, towns, transit agencies, special districts that are subdivisions of a state, and federally recognized tribal governments are eligible for and can apply for funding through this grant program.

There are two types of SS4A grants, specifically Action Plan Grants and Implementation Grants. Each applicant can submit only one grant application per year, either for an Action Plan Grant or an Implementation Grant, and the applicant will be the direct recipient of the funds. The program requires a 20% local match for either grant type. All matching funds must be from non-federal sources and may include cash or in-kind services such as staff labor on projects. The source of the local match should be identified in the grant application.

Action Plan Grants are used to create an Action Plan that identifies projects and/or strategies to reduce and prevent roadway fatalities and serious injuries. Action Plans have specific detailed requirements that must be followed for the projects and/or strategies identified in the Action Plan to qualify for Implementation Grants. Action Plans must include leadership commitment and goal setting that includes a timeline for eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries or a timeline of reduction percentages with an eventual goal to eliminate roadway fatalities and serious injuries. Specifically, Action Plans must include the following:

- 1. Leadership commitment and goal setting
- 2. Planning structure through a committee
- 3. Safety analysis
- 4. Engagement and collaboration with the public and relevant stakeholders
- 5. Equity considerations using inclusive and representative processes
- 6. Assessment of current polices and identification of opportunities for improvement
- 7. Comprehensive set of projects and strategies to address identified safety problems
- 8. Description of how progress will be measured and public transparency methods

To take advantage of these funding opportunities, we would recommend the MPO apply for an Action Plan Grant in the current year, Year 1. As discussed at the OCOG meeting, this application can include rural Ouachita Parish, the City of Monroe, and the City of West Monroe. This will allow each jurisdiction to apply for implementation Grants to implement projects and/or strategies identified in the completed Action Plan for their respective jurisdiction.

The estimated cost of creating an Action Plan for Quachita Parish, which includes rural Quachita Parish, the City of Monroe, and the City of West Monroe is \$400,000. Neel-Schaffer will assist the MPO with submitting the grant application at no cost. If the Action Plan Grant is approved for the estimated cost, 80% of the cost to create the Action plan would be funded by the grant (\$320,00) and 20% would require local funding (\$80,000). Please note that the deadline for completing the Action Plan Grant application for Year 1 is September 15, 2022; therefore, a decision regarding the Action Plan Grant application will need to be made as soon as possible to meet this deadline.

Starting in Year 2, rural Ouachita Parish, the City of Monroe, and the City of West Monroe can separately apply for Implementation Grant funds to implement projects and/or strategies identified in the Action Plan for their respective jurisdictions.



MAP costs:

2 MAP trucks, 12hrs/day, weekdays and a MAP area manager 40hrs/week: \$520,000/year

therefore exempt from discovery or admission into evidence pursuant to 23 U.S.C. 407.

MPO is responsible for half of the cost or \$260,000.

The process would be for the MPO to agree and the TIP will need to be updated to reflect this cost. Dawn Sholmire (dawn.sholmire@la.gov) with DOTD may be able to help with this.

Once this is done let us know and we can work to get the funding added to the project. Then we would work on an estimated start date.

We would also need to come up with a location for a MAP office.

MAP coverage area:

We can discuss what would be best but here is my proposal:

I-20 from Well Road (Exit 112) to LA 594 Millhaven/Russel Sage (Exit 124), 12 miles

MAP services:

All MAP Operators shall provide the following Roadway services:

- · Traffic control when first on-site of an incident.
- · Traffic control at an incident under the direction of the on-site incident commander.
- · Remove minor debris from the highway.
- Tag abandoned vehicles left on the shoulder.
- · Apply absorbent material on the following fluids spilled on the highway:
 - Fuel
 - Oil
 - Transmission fluid
 - Coolant
- · Suppress small vehicle fires.
