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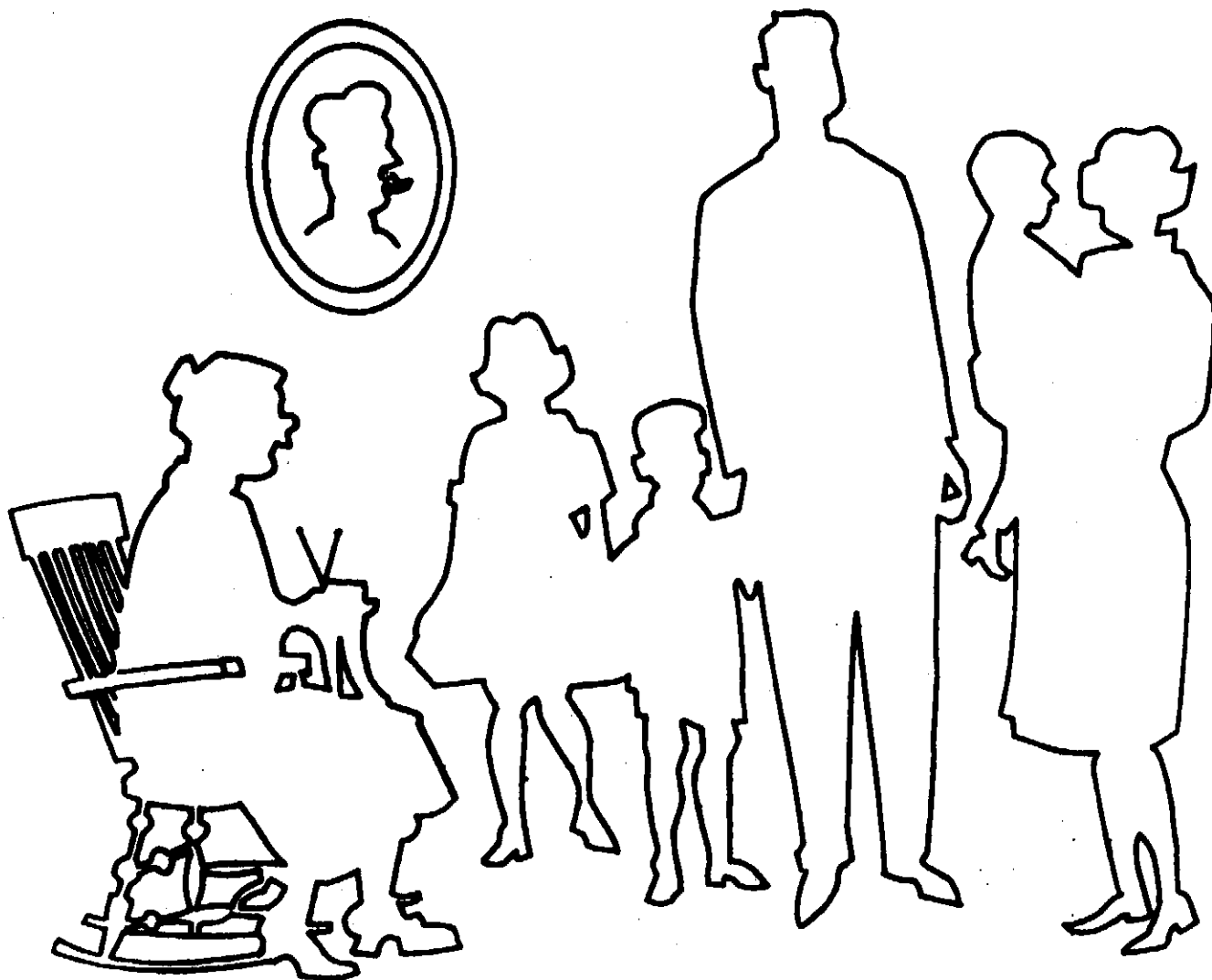

Dear Members,

You are in the TOP 500! Already this year (20 January 1978!) over 500 have either just joined our Society, or regular members have sent in early renewals! This really GREAT! More reasons than one!

The number of issues, each year, is a big problem. At the beginning of 1977 it was decided, since our 1976 years ended with 742 or so members, 900 copies would be plenty to run for 1977. All went very well, until after the June issue had been printed. Then we began to run short! So as time would permit, March 1977 was re-printed! Later as time would permit, the June issue was re-printed! 200 more at that time was printed. Total of 1100. Seemed fine, but then some members need extra issues, for various reasons. (They paid for them, but there went our issues!) For the 1977 year, our membership list showed 1015 (then we stopped counting, as the renewals began pouring in, along with new memberships for 1978!).

When we receive a new membership: a metal addressograph plate is made with name, address, city, state, and zip code, then this is filed in zip code order. Also two cards are made for two different files: one for our Membership Chairman, and the other for the Editor's file (these two people live in different cities, remember!). Then the money is turned over to our Treasurer, and in turn deposited in the bank.

Can you imagine doing all this over one thousand times?

Queries come in all the time, and as you should notice this time, a large part of our Arkansas Family Historian is filled with your Queries. 1977 our membership really increased, and with most all letters of either inquiry about membership, or fees, etc. came a request for help in search of lost ancestors.

If there are dates, names, or other valuable information in the mail, it is processed as a Query for a future data. This seems to be a valuable service, and should be taken as a service, as there is no fee charged, so no obligation on the part of your Editor should be expected, as to a certain date the Query will be published. All Queries (if legible) are usually published as soon as possible.

This early-renewal system has helped with our filing and changing addresses, etc. Everything has to be very near perfect before the postal service can do the correct job. Our mail is being delivered a little more quickly, and damage is not as bad. However - and someone in TEXAS please note - One order of ANCESTOR CHARTS reached Ft. Worth, Texas and became damaged - the Postal Service sent us a letter, but the address was lost. We need to know what member failed to receive an order of Ancestor Charts?

ANCESTOR CHART VOLUMES - the Number 10 Volume will be released about, in time for Spring Meeting - March 11.

Many of our new members would like to know about the ANCESTOR CHART VOLUMES. In 1975 we published Volume I. This Volume is 66 Charts compiled by individuals and contributed for publication by the Arkansas Genealogical Society. In the front the compiler's name, address, etc. is listed. In the back, an index of all Surnames listed on the Charts. This project became so popular, to this date we are still gathering more Charts and hope to publish (in groups of about 65, in each volume) others. Each Volume is \$3. and many members, as well as Libraries have collected all volumes and we have standing orders for each volume published.

Another of our projects is the FAMILY GROUP VOLUMES. The first of this new project will be published about May 1978. Almost enough charts have been gathered already for two volumes. Many need to be typed or may be retyped. Always clean the type very good, use a good dark ribbon, and send us the original copy, you keep the xerox copy. We would rather you type your own charts (less chance of error, than when someone who does not know your family, does the typing). But if you cannot type, do the best you can (either print, or write very plain). Many names and places are strange, but we will have them typed before they are published.

If you do not know whether your chart has been published yet, or do not know which volume your chart might be published, drop us a note, and be sure to include your S.A.S.E. (Self addressed stamped envelope). Make sure you have addressed your envelope correctly and check again to make sure you have included your zip code. Ask "which volume your chart might be published". If you have moved, be sure to mention that also.

To those of you who have been members for an undetermined number of years, this is a reminder! In Volume X ANCESTOR CHARTS, this was the 1977 Lamon Library Class, and only 6 out of the entire Volume remembered to include their zip code. They are not the only ones!! Much time is wasted, by ME looking up zip codes, and I might mention several envelopes have returned to our office, with Self addressed stamped envelopes, with also wrong addresses and wrong zip codes. We all need to check everything

All is not bad! I just hate to spend money on returned mail! So those of you who have to MOVE, be sure to notify us before you notify the movers! One thing after the Quarterly is sent, and returned in the mail, it does not look fresh, and sometimes we are ashamed to send it out again.

We are so proud to have so much of the membership renewals marked for 1978 and new plates made, etc., now maybe we can get along to other things.

The stacks of mail just never seem to get smaller, but as long as the mail piles into our headquarters, we will not be short of material for our Arkansas Family Historian. Again 200 pages plus index in December issue, can be promised, if your information continues to come. You are encouraged to write your Family History (make it as easy to understand, as possible) and be sure it is as correct as possible). Keep a sharp eye open for Bible Records, we also would like to know who has the Bible at present. All of you know your Editor does not know how to number pages! Most usually information for our Quarterly is prepared several months in advance. Usually skip the first four or so pages and start numbering, so some of it can be printed far in advance, so collating (putting the sheets together) can be begun. Then just before time to finish, the first few pages are completed and placed in the front. This may seem strange. But we do not have a paid staff, and as you can notice our members live to far from Little Rock to drop over to help. While this has been mentioned our Headquarters is where your Editor lives. We have never had enough money to rent a large office (or small one). We would rather spend our money on our publication, and try to print additional ANCESTOR CHART VOLUMES & FAMILY GROUP VOLUMES. When our publication goes for printing, it goes from (what originally was the dining room & good for being dusted only) to the back room and another small building apart from my house.

ARKANSAS CSA SOLDIERS (1911 Census of Confederate Veterans) Surnames A thru D, Volume I. In 1911, the Public Acts of Arkansas No. 353, provided that an enumeration or census be made by the tax assessor of each county, of Confederate veterans residing in Arkansas. This first volume in the series lists surnames A through D, in the 44 counties represented in the original questionnaires - no records are found for the 31 remaining counties. The 1751 questionnaires list the full name of the veteran, his post office address, date and place of birth, date, State and County of enlistment, full name and place of birth of subject's parents, grandparents, maiden name of wife, with date and place of marriage; names of her parents, and full list of children, with spouses. BOOK REVIEWS

GIFTS TO; OUR ARKANSAS GENEALOGICAL SOCIETY LIBRARY

"GRIMES, COOK AND RELATED FAMILIES of Wayne County, Tennessee, 1800-1960" by James Cook Grimes, A Genealogy - Related Families - Johnson, Morris, Montague.

Ancestors of this American family came from Great Britain and were members of the landed gentry. Among the first of the name in America were John and Walter Grimes of James City County, Virginia in 1635, William Grimes in 1638, Arthur Grimes of Charles River County, Virginia, in 1638, Samuel Grimes of Boston, Massachusetts, before 1639 and Rev. Charles Grimes York County, Virginia in 1744. Descendents of these immigrants have spread to all parts of the country and this book gives their story.

The book has been well researched with records around Wayne County, Tennessee, their base. The descendents are each numbered and the contents well organized in family groups. Every name is included in the general index and a bibliography is given.

"VAN ALSTYNE - VAN ALSTINE FAMILY HISTORY, Volume I." by Lester Van Alstine, R R 3, Salem, Wis. 53168, published in 1974.

The name Van Alstine went through many changes while the families were in Holland and traced back to 936. The name in general signified "old or high stone". The Province of Drenthe in Holland has furnished many families of American ancestors.

This book begins with Jan Martense Van Alstine and his wife Dirckje Harmense and two children: Herman and Abraham who came to New Amsterdam (New York) prior to July 18, 1655, but the date of arrival is not recorded. Complete details of his life and dealings have been researched from many old Dutch records.

Many complete families are included in the biographies of descendents. They reach all over the country and special attention is given to those of Van Alstyne, Texas. The history of this family is complete and interesting as it gives the local history. This valuable book has a complete all name index. It may be obtained for \$12.00 prepaid from Lester Van Alstine, Rt. 3, Box 139, Salem, Wisconsin 53168.

"RECORDS OF CRAWFORD COUNT, ARKANSAS" compiled by Mrs. Oma Cole and Mrs. Hazel Brown and was presented to our Library by these two ladies.

These records are in three parts: Marriage Book A, 1877 - 1880, Early (Arkansas) Gazette Records of Crawford County, Marriages from 1829 to 1842, and Early Van Buren Press Records of Marriages in Crawford County, Arkansas 1860-1875. The index is of all Surnames mentioned. Mailing addresses of compilers are: Oma Cole, Rt. 3, Box 1, Alma, AR 72921 and Hazel Brown, Rt. 1, Alma, AR 72921

"THE VIRDINS OF DELAWARE AND RELATED FAMILIES", published in July 1976, and "Some Pioneer Delaware Families" by Donald Odell Virdin. In the words of the author who donated these two volumes "since some of the people mentioned in the books lived in your area, I thought you might be interested".

The first Virdin in America noted was "transported to the Virginia Colony" in August 1635 but the first Virdin to settle in Delaware was John Virdin who bought land in Kent County in 1732. Life in Colonial Delaware is the interesting sidelight in relating the history of the family. The Virdin book is well documented with many copied references and has an excellent index.

The second volume of "Pioneer Delaware Families" includes the following families: Broadway, Carter, Gilder, Lowber, Marvel, Register, Reynolds and Rodney. This book includes also new developments on the Virden family. Information sources from Ohio, California and Colorado researchers as well as those in Delaware are drawn upon.

Both of these books are interesting and pleasant to read partly due to the excellent typing recording the family histories.

MORRIS MITCHELL - ELIZABETH HOOSING FAMILY

1. MORRIS MITCHELL

Morris Mitchell, b. 29 August 1762, Montgomery Co., Maryland. WILL recorded 31 January 1848, Polk Co., Missouri. Joined Militia in Washington Co., PA, aged 16. He married ca 1781 ELIZABETH HOOSING, b. 15 April 1766 in TN died 3 September 1808, (aged 93) in Polk Co., Missouri. She was the daughter of JACOB HOOSING, Rev. soldier, who emigrated from Germany. Morris was an ordained clergy of Methodist Episcopal Church. (Morris, a minister, is listed on a court order of 10/1832 in Roane Co., TN., and he lists his neighbors as JESSE MORRIS, ELIJAH & STEPHEN MITCHELL. Also on census of 1830 in Roane Co., TN., with 3 younger children living at home. ALSO we find on the 1830 census of Montgomery Co., Md., a MORRIS MITCHELL listed as #170 having in his household 01001-01001-01)

ISSUE:

- 11 John Mitchell, b. 7/21/1782 married 3/4/1805 in Roane Co., TN Betsy McRay or McVey. They had a son MORRIS R. MITCHELL, b. 9/17/1810 in Blount Co., TN. married 1/9/1829 in Rowan Co., TN ANNIE EWING and moved to Cedar Co., MO b. 1835. Pauline Mitchell Webster who died 1975 (aged 63) was a great granddaughter of Morris R. Mitchell. She taught school in San Diego for many years. Her surviving brother, who also lives in San Diego, CA is Gorden Keith Mitchell. Also kin to this line is Glen Terhune, 2009 Brookhaven, Abilene, TX 79605.
- 12 JACOB MITCHELL, b. 5/1/1784 married LUCINA HASTING
- 13 JAMES MITCHELL, b. 10/19/1786 in Knoc Co., TN died 1876 in Knox Co., TN married in Roane Co., TN SARAH NAVE, b. 1790 died 1853 in Polk Co. MO the daughter of GEORGE NAVE. (The Nave family were among the VERY EARLY settlers of TN). They had a daughter ELIZABETH MITCHELL who married WM. MONTGOMERY. Their son JAMES MONTGOMERY has a living (7/1975) granddaughter, MRS. ANNA TUMMINS, 229 N. Seneca Ave., Springfield, MO. 65802.
- 14 REBECCA MITCHELL, b. 1/30/1789 married NATHAN SULLENS. (We note in Tennessee Cousins by Worth Ray, that a NATHAN SULLINS was a Rev. soldier of Roane Co., TN.)
- 15 ABRAHAM MITCHELL, b. 1/29/1791 married POLLY COULTER. (We also note in Tennessee Cousins that a THOMAS COULTER, Rev. Soldier came to Roane Co., TN from North Carolina).
- 16 MARY MITCHELL, b. 2/11/1793 married WM. WINTON, a brother of John A. WINTON. Mary and her husband went to Washington County, Arkansas after Civil War and died there. They had a daughter, JANE who married REV. ANTHONY BEWLEY. Bewley was accused of instigating a riot in Texas so fled back to Missouri. Picked up and taken back to Ft. Worth, Texas, where the people got him out of jail and hung him. Mary also had a son REV. GEORGE MITCHELL WINTON who had a son GEORGE Beverly Winton, b. Springfield, MO, died in 1930's.
- 17 RHODA MITCHELL, b. 5/19/1795 in Roane Co., TN died 9/3/1886 aged 91 yrs, 3 mo. 14 days in Roane Co., TN. She married JAMES WINTON who was born and who died 3/17/1849 in Roane Co., TN aged 62 yrs. Had 11 issue - the 4th being JOHN A WINTON, b. 2/2/1819 in Roane Co., TN married 1st 2/2/1843 SUSANNA BAKER. Married 2nd 11/27/1877 CARRIE P. (Smith) CORRY, daughter of John Young Smith of Roane Co., TN a lawyer who was son of Meriwether Smith and Sally Payne. (Goodspeed's history of East TN, published 1887) (Also if anyone wishes to know the SMITH/PAYNE history, they can probably get it by writing: Mrs. John E. BLACK, 913 North Graycroft Ave., Madison, TN 37115)
- 18 JESSIE MITCHELL, b. 3/18/1798 married PROVIDENCE NORWOOD who was (Thomas Norwood, Wash. Co., AR 1830 Census) a sister to Sarah Norwood. The parents of the Norwood sisters were Thomas Norwood, Washington Co., AR 1830 Census). John NORWOOD (Rev. soldier) and MARY HALE buried in Blount Co., TN. John Norwood's parents are buried in Baltimore, Md. Jessie's son G. L. MITCHELL moved to Dawson Co., TX in 1907 and was active in the Lamesa Methodist Church. His granddaughter MRS. LEOLA MITCHELL CLARK'S address is Box 213, Sterling Rt. Big Springs, Texas 79720.
- 19 BETSEY MITCHELL, b. 3/16/1800 married JOHN McLURE
- 1A STEPHEN MITCHELL, b. 8/2/1802 married 1st Sarah Norwood. 2nd Martha Bond. 3rd Elizabeth Hair. 4th Abbie Patterson.

- 1B Elijah Mitchell, b. 9/13/1804 married POLLY CAMPBELL. (Also listed in Tennessee Cousins by Worth Ray is a Rev. soldier living in Roane Co., TN JOHN CAMPBELL.)
- 1C WESLEY MITCHELL, b. 3/11/1810 married CYNTHIA GILLIAN. They had a daughter Rebecca Mitchell who married JOHN ANDERSON, and they in turn had a daughter Rachel Anderson who married H. M. Sanford who in turn had a son Mitchell Sanford, of 611 Cate St., Jonesboro, Ark. 72401.
- 1D LOUISE MITCHELL, b. 7/12/1813 married DAVID M. McLURE.

1A STEPHEN MITCHELL

Stephen Mitchell, b. 8/27/1802 married 1st 9/7/1824 SARAH NORWOOD, b. 2/28/1803, the daughter of Rev. soldier John Norwood & wife Mary Hale, buried in Roane Co., TN. Married 2nd 11/26/1839 MARTHA BOND who had two sons by previous marriage: Ben & Holbert BOND. Married 3rd 8/24/1854 ELIZABETH HAIR. Married 4th 3/26/1874 ABBIE PATTERSON. He took up his farm in Arkansas about 1835.

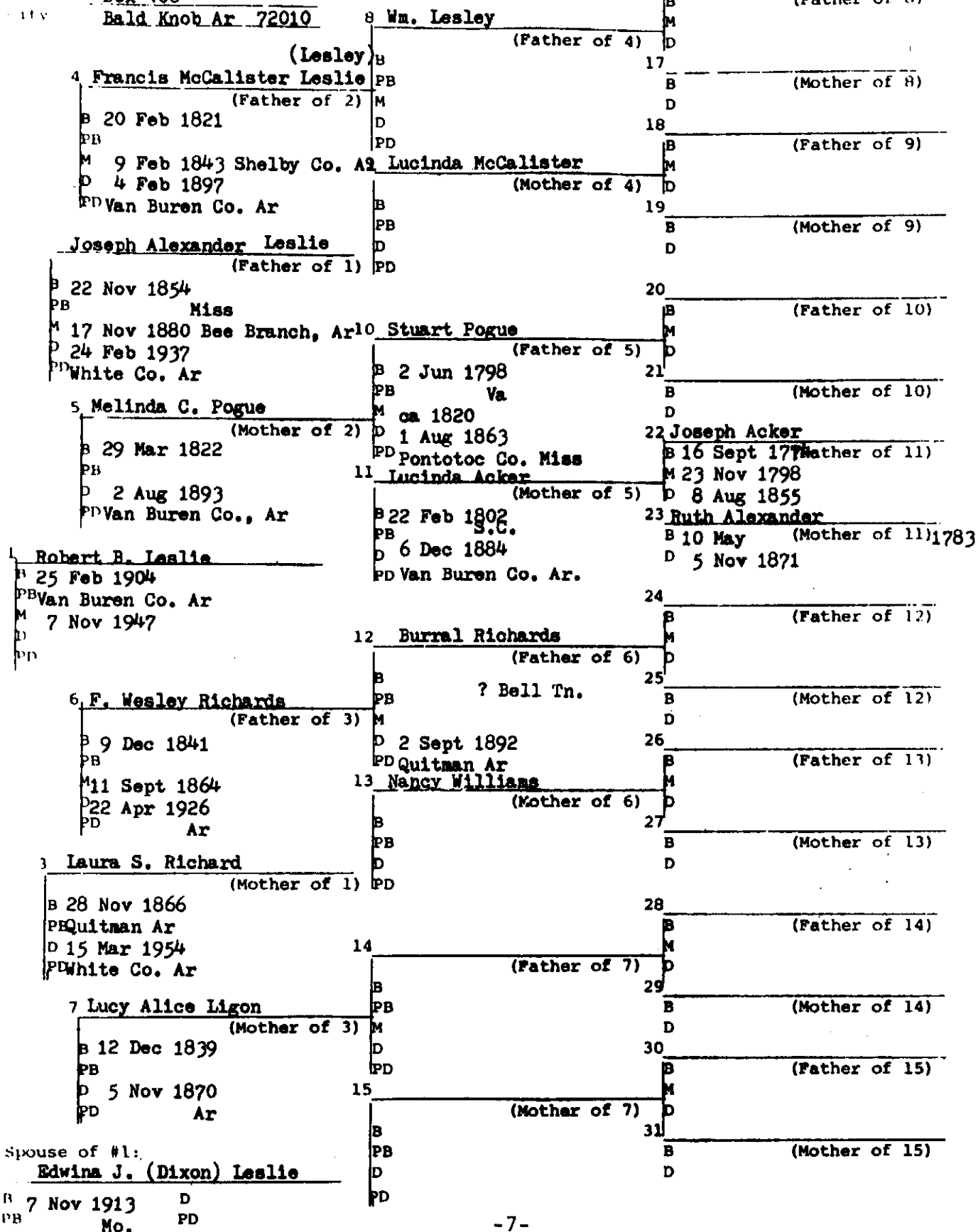

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following was also contributed by Mrs. Edwina Jo. Leslie, Box 406, Bald Knob, AR 72010.

A short time ago the Twenty-Five Years Ago items in the Free Press included reference to the dedication of the M. E. Church at Mitchell's Camp Ground. The building had just been erected on the old camp meeting ground, which had for seventy year been a seat of Methodism. As many of our readers are intimately acquainted with Mitchell's Camp Ground, and with the Mitchell Family, which has numerous descendants who live in this country, the Free Press republishes below the Historical article by Rev. W. H. Winton, which appeared in the Free Press in 1905, the next week after the dedication of the building.

The Camp Ground was organized in the Conference year of 1834-35, and connected with the Green Circuit, Little Rock district, J. P. Neil, P.C., and J. K. Lacy, P. E. The Class was organized in the home of Ransom Cates and he and his family constituted at that time the large part of its membership.

The first house of worship was built of logs in 1836. The second was built of brick, in 1858, and the third, of brick, has just been finished, and dedicated January 8, 1905, by the writer.

Some idea of the scattered state of the work at the time of the organization may be gained by the fact that this country and Little Rock, Ark., were in the same District. Missouri, Arkansas, and the Indian Territory, were all included in one Annual Conference, with a membership of 7,944 whites, 1,061 colored, and 889 Indians.

The Springfield District was formed in 1838, and Jacob Lanius was its first Presiding Elder. The Bolivar Circuit was formed in 1845 and J. C. Derick was its first pastor. The first camp meeting was held in the fall of 1841. The Mitchells had recently moved from Tennessee and settled in the vicinity, and they were so numerous and there were so many Methodists among them the Camp Ground was named after them. Morris Mitchell, the Patriarch of the Tribe, was a local Methodist preacher. He had three sons and ten grandsons who were, and are, Methodist preachers, and nephews and great grandsons too numerous to mention. The statement is made that when his wife (who out lived him) died, there were 720 of her descendants. Her funeral took place during a session of the camp meeting. The long procession consisting mostly of her own children, grand children, and great grandchildren, formed at the house of Judge D. M. McLure, where she had died, and followed the casket, which was borne on foot to the Camp Ground. As the march began someone started the old song, "We Are Traveling to the Grave." Capt. Jack Mitchell, a grandson, who was one of the pall bearers, tells me that as the song was taken up along the line, he never heard such singing. It may be he will never hear such again until the Mitchells sing together in Heaven.

So much for the name of the ground. But while the Mitchells have played a leading part in the history of this sacred place, many other families have had their share. Truly this is one of the sacred places of Israel. Let us look into the past. What conflicts our fathers and mothers had with the enemies of the soul, and what victories there were in the name of Jesus! If on the day of the judgment the King should invite all who were converted at Mitchell's Camp Ground to stand up, we should behold an army indeed, and O, how many of them we should know and love!

"And There Buildded He An Alter Unto the Lord"

About half way between Aldrich and Wishart, beside the clear, rippling waters of Walnut Creek, stands the alter of our earliest pioneers, the historic Mitchell's Camp Ground. This spot, made sacred by the tears and

prayers of some of the best families that ever honored our country, is marked now by a little brick church building about 30 by 40 feet, erected in 1904, and to its north a specious and thickly dotted cemetery.

Burials here date back even to the late 30's. Many of our pioneer families used it and their children and grandchildren continue to use it as a family burying place.

The Camp Ground was a hot-bed of early Methodism. Uncle Morris Mitchell, born July 22, 1762, and who had spent years in his native state preaching, was among the early emigrants to the county. He settled what is now known as the Capt. Jack Mitchell farm, owned at present by Asbury Mitchell, just a mile southeast of the present church. He brought with him the great family Bible that he had used for years in Tennessee, and in which the geneology of the family is written. His son, James, was also a minister.

It was only natural that these pious pioneers should assemble, as custom was, for seasons of worship. They found a shady dell, alongside a grove of towering "shell-bark" hickories, with a fine spring hardly a stones throw away.

Here they started in a brush arbor split seats. People for miles around would come to these services and camp out. The meeting place was surrounded with campers year after year. There were great singers as well as great preachers in this pioneer group. How souls were stirred and lifted as these stalwart pioneers swung in after their leaders, "long meter" or "short meter", on these stirring old hymns of our forefathers! No wonder there were shouts of "new born souls" and shouts of rejoicing over the salvation of sinners.

In 1858 a commodious frame building was erected. It served for many useful years. The last great meeting held in it was held in 1896. It was led by "Uncle George" Winton, father of W. H. Winton. "Such a meeting as we did have", said an eye witness. "Such crowds as we did have! A score of preachers, hundreds of Methodists, Baptist, and all other denominations, coming from miles and miles around."

The Camp Ground had had its ups and downs, however. In the dark days of the Civil War, the community was divided in sentiment and some of its young men went south and some north. This feeling paralyzed religious work there, but soon after the War harmony again prevailed, religious fervor conquering War prejudices.

There has been no regular preaching there for many years now, except for memorial services and funeral discourses.

Now for a few minutes let us look into the history of the people who made this spot famous. Here are some records taken from the old family Bible of Rev. Morris Mitchell, and handed down through succeeding generations and now in possession of Uncle Frank Mitchell, a grandson. Tuesday morning, the editor and Uncle Jim Lon Mitchell drove down to Uncle Frank's to see this famous Bible and examine the family record.

This record shows that Rev. Morris Mitchell had a large family. His wife was Elizabeth and she was born in Tennessee, April 15, 1776. The children were John, born 22 July 1782; Jacob, 1 May 1784; James, 19 October 1786; Rebecca, 30 January 1789; Abraham, 23 January 1791; Mary, 11 February 1793; Rhoda, 19 May 1795; *Jesse, 8 March 1798; Betty, 16 March 1800; Stephen, 2 August 1802; Elijah, 17 September 1804; Wesley, 11 March 1810; Louisa, 12 July, 1813. * Jesse & Stephen M. Norwood sisters.

The Bible passed to Stephen. He was married four times and had children by the first two wives. He and Sarah Norwood Mitchell were married 7 September 1824. She was born 28 February 1803. Born of this union were Mary Elizabeth, 8 December 1825; James Harvey Clark, 19 May 1827; Louisa Caroline, 8 August, 1828; Leah Jane, 11 March 1830; Stephen Columbus, 18 September 1831; Sarah Louisa, 8 April 1833; Esther Tennessee, 2 September 1834; Rhoda Emily, 8 November 1836; and Albert Wesley Norwood, 2 March 1838. These were all born in Tennessee.

His second wife was Martha Bond Mitchell, whom he married 26 November 1839. She had two sons, Ben and Holbert Bond. To them were born: Lafayette Jackson (Capt. Jack), 8 October 1840; Martha Louisa, 22 May 1842; Louisa Caroline, 29 April 1844; Stephen Blunt, 19 May 1846; Morris Asbury, 18 April 1848; Rebecca Missouri, 18 May 1850; John Denver, 25 January 1853; Franklin Pierce, 2 February 1854.

His third wife was Elizabeth Hair, to whom he was married 24 August 1854 and his fourth, Abbie Patterson, 26 March 1874.

Franklin Poerce Mitchell, "Uncle Frank" as we call him now, married Orlena Elizabeth Lane in this county, 12 October 1880, Rev. Davenport, a Presbyterian Minister, performing the ceremony at his own home near the Oakville Church. Their only son, Lafayette Jackson Mitchell, born 16 July 1882 died 2 September 1906. Their daughter, Mrs. Rachel Caroline Cowan, and her son, Glen, live with Mr. and Mrs. Mitchell.

Uncle Frank was born on the farm where he now lives. It was taken up by his father in 1835. He bought a few improvements from a widow who had probably lived there several years previous. His name was Russell.

The high esteem in which Rev. Morris Mitchell and his wife were held is shown by some data on a little piece of paper that had been filed alongside the data of the family. On it is this notation about Mrs. Mitchell's funeral: "Elizabeth Mitchell, consort of Morris Mitchell, died at age of 93, buried at Mitchell's Camp Ground, September 4, 1858. There were 700 relatives at the funeral. Her body was carried by grandchildren and great grandchildren from the home to the church. As they crossed the creek, they began singing, "We are traveling to the grave, to lay this body down, etc."

REUNION HELD AT MITCHELL CAMP GROUND - 1962

August 26, 1962, is a date that will long be remembered by grandchildren, great-grandchildren, great great grandchildren and other relatives and friends who were present at the reunion of the Albert Wesley and Susan Newman Mitchell family.

Albert Wesley Mitchell was one of the sons of Stephen Mitchell who came to Missouri in the 1830's from Tennessee and homesteaded a large acreage of land in the southern part of Polk County, Missouri.

Albert Wesley Mitchell and Susan Newman were united in marriage on Christmas Day, December 25, 1862. To this union were born fifteen children fourteen whom reached adulthood, married and had children. All are deceased except Adam Cla... Mitchell of Denver, Colo., and Rome Mitchell of Aldrich, MO.

Out of the 68 grandchildren of this family, 29 were present at the reunion.

The Mitchell Camp Ground is southeast of Aldrich, was selected for the meeting because of the significance of this old landmark. Back in the early days of the family, they, along with the neighbors, would gather and camp for a week or more for Methodist revival meeting.

Since this year is the hundredth anniversary of the marriage of the grandparents, the grandchildren planned a reunion. The honorees were to be the two living uncles -- Adam C. Mitchell who is 92, and Rome Mitchell who is 80. Rome was unable to attend, however, because he became ill and had to be taken to St. John's Hospital in Springfield, Mo. Adam made the trip from Denver and proudly handed out calling cards which read: "Smile today-tomorrow may be worse."

Know ye that the will and testament of Morris Mitchell, Senior, deceased hath in due form of law been exhibited, proved and recorded in the office of the Clerk of the County Court of Polk C., Court for Polk Co., MO. a copy has been filed & it appears that David M. McClure and Morris Mitchell Junr. have been appointed executors in and by the said last Will and testament to execute the same and to the end that the property of the testator may be preserved for those who shall appear to have legal right or interest therein and that the said last will may be executed according to the request of the testator. We do hereby authorize him the said D M McClure and Morris Mitchell Junr as executors to collect and receive all and singular the goods and chattles right and credits which were of the said Morris Mitchell Senior at the time of his death in whosoever hands or possession the same may be found and to perform and fulfill all such duties as may be enjoined upon them by said WILL so far as there shall be property and the law charge him and in general to do and perform all other acts and things which are or hereafter may be required of them by law.

In testimony whereof I William Foushee Judge of Probate in and for the county of Polk, MO. aforesaid have here unto signed my name and affixed my private seal there being no public seal yet provided at office this 29th day of January 1848.

"OUR GOODLY HERITAGE"
Memorial Weekend - May, 1975
Mitchell Camp Ground Cemetery

We are here today to pay tribute to the many roots and branches of the Mitchell family. This is our first time to be afforded this very singular honor. Whereas we did not inherit the surname of MITCHELL, we were privileged to have it as a Christian name, being the descendant of Wesley Mitchell, the youngest son and 12th child of the Missouri founding family. We do also have claim to being one of the members of the vast group of Mitchell clergy--and will, hopefully, be another example in the family's tradition of longevity!

Let us apply the respectful title of "Patriarch" to our Missouri father, Morris Mitchell. He, like Abraham of old, founded a succession that has become like "the stars of the heavens and the sand of the sea" throughout this nation, and even the world.

It is especially appropriate this year, as we enter the celebration of our nation's Bicentennial, that we honor our ancestor who fought in the War for American Independence. Morris Mitchell was born in 1762 in Montgomery County, Maryland, and was of Scotch-Irish-German ancestry. At 16 years of age, he became a militiaman in Washington County, Pennsylvania where he served in the Revolutionary War. He married Elizabeth Hoosing around 1781; she was of Dutch descent. Between 1782 and 1813, the Mitchells had 13 children, all of whom lived to adulthood and were married.

We are ignorant of the whereabouts and activities of the Morris Mitchell family from the time after the War until the early 1800's in Eastern Tennessee. We do know that he had become an ordained clergyman in the Methodist Episcopal Church, for we have found records of his having performed marriage ceremonies in Tennessee. The migrations from Pennsylvania and Maryland to Tennessee and other Southern states were common patterns for Revolutionary War veterans who were offered free land grants there. Morris Mitchell and his family did not come to Missouri until he was about 70 years of age.

A basic document of the Morris Mitchell family was his 1848 WILL registered in Polk County, Missouri, in which he provided for his widow, Elizabeth, and listed terms for granting freedom to his slaves. Also mentioned in the WILL were his two youngest living sons, Stephen and Wesley, and David McLure, husband of his youngest child, Louise. He also mentioned Morris "Junior" or Morris R. Mitchell, the oldest son of his eldest son, John.

His wife, Elizabeth, survived Morris Mitchell by six years, living to be 93 years of age. Our maternal grandmother, Rebecca Mitchell Anderson, told us of having attended this funeral in 1858 were hundreds of her relatives formed the funeral march here at this Mitchell Camp Ground. Can't we see and hear the 700 and more relatives marching with the coffin of this Patriarch as they sang, "We Are Going to the Grave to Lay This Body Down"?

A Polk County historian made mention of the fact that Elizabeth and Morris Mitchell had lived to see 18 of their descendants answer the call to the ministry. This outstanding record has been acknowledged in "Who's Who in America of Clergymen's Children".

A decade after the death of Elizabeth Mitchell found members of their family embroiled in the bitternesses of the Civil War. As one writer said, "some of the sons went North and some South". At least three of the family men were killed in Mississippi on the side of the Confederacy.

The most vivid Civil War incident involving the Mitchells was that of Reverend Anthony Bewley, son-in-law of William and Mary Mitchell Winton, and husband of their daughter, Jane. The Reverend Bewley took an abolitionist stand in an inflamed pro-slavery area of Texas. He was charged with inciting slaves to riot. Pursued from Texas to Missouri by bounty hunters, he was taken from his wife and returned to Ft. Worth where a lynch mob broke into the jail and hanged him. The evidence of his guilt was a letter he was alleged to have written. It was later proved to have been forged.

The War wounds were fairly well healed by the 1890's when the Reverend George Mitchell Winton, son of William and Mary Winton, and brother-in-law of the Reverend Bewley, lead a notable revival of religion here at the Mitchell Camp Ground. A capable and gifted man who had endured many of the dangers and privations of the war period, George Winton headed a succession of Winston ministers, continuing to the contemporary Fielding Winton, with whom we have corresponded through the years.

As we continue to the more recent history of the family, we choose to make reference to two of Morris Mitchell's descendants with whom we have

had personal acquaintance: George Beverly Winton, son fo George Mitchell Winton, was born in Springfield, Missouri during the Civil War and died in the 1930's. He was a product of the Scarrett-Morrisville College which was founded and largely controlled by the Mitchell family from around 1870 until the 1920's. (The land had been given by Morris W. Mitchell for whom Morrisville was named). George B. Winton went through the spectrum of the Methodist Ministry, including that of pastor, Presiding Elder, seminary professor, missionary to Mexico, Editor of "The Southern Christian Advocate" and author of books dealing with international problems.

Another noteworthy example of Mitchell family achievement is Benjamin Ernest Mitchell, Ph. D., son of W. B. (Doc) and Rachel Mitchell Mitchell, who lived from the late Nineteenth Century to the 1960's. Having known Ernest Mitchell, we recognize him as a person of intellectual genius as well as of deep religious piety. He had served as Professor of Mathematics at Millsaps College in Jackson, Mississippi where there is a building named for him and a Chair of Mathematics in his honor.

One writer has described the Mitchells of Polk County, Missouri, as "men of large frames, large families, and large hearts." We would add to that, "and large in years", or in longevity. It is appropriate today to acknowledge the one known living great-grandchild of Morris and Elizabeth Mitchell, a Mrs. Marr of San Angelo, Texas, who is almost 100 years of age.

This brings us to the present occasion, where we have attempted to perpetuate the memory and spirits of the men and women who have given us our goodly heritage.

We will conclude with this prayer from the ritual of the Daughters of American Revolution:

"Our Father in Heaven, we thank Thee for Thy guidance and for Thy abiding presence in the life of our country. We thank Thee for all those yesterdays of our human race whose lessons and fulfillments have become a heritage to us. Continue, we pray, Thy blessings upon this nation, that all who are a part of it may learn true nobility of manhood and womanhood. Grant us growth in understanding and increasing devotion to righteousness. Amen".

BITS AND PIECES OF INFORMATION!
by Edwin Swafford

In studying genealogy, one uncovers many bits and pieces of information. Some of it useful, some not so useful. Some of it may be puzzling, such as the information on Jasper or Newton County. This should get researchers to wondering a bit about other similar incidents. Towns were named by railroad engineers as they extended the rail lines westward. The four towns of Greenville (particularly from South Carolina, Georgia, Mississippi, and Texas) come to mind. Another four are in a westerly line: Virginia, West Virginia, Kentucky and Missouri. Try another four: Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois. I forgot Alabama and Florida. The Post Office Directory list 26 states with the town of Greenville.

My information came from the Handy Book by the Everton Publishers. I am also enclosing a map with the counties outlined.

LITTLE KNOWN STATISTICS OF JASPER AND NEWTON COUNTIES

There are nine states which have either a Jasper or a Newton County. Five of these nine states have both Jasper and Newton counties. The interesting point to mention about these two counties in these five states is that in all five states, Jasper and Newton counties are joined together. These states are Georgia, Indiana, Mississippi, Missouri and Texas.

The other four states, which have only one of these counties, are Arkansas, Illinois, Iowa, and South Carolina. The Arkansas county of Newton, has the county seat of Jasper. Illinois and Iowa both have Jasper counties; and both have Newton as their county seat! The South Carolina county of Jasper has Ridgeland as its county seat.

One wonders why these two counties of Jasper and Newton are found either together in pairs or have similar county seats. It is interesting to note that four out of five states which have Jasper and Newton counties connected, have county seats with other names. Only the state of Texas has Jasper and Newton counties with the same name for their county seats!

Below is a chart showing when the county was formed, its parent county and its county seat.

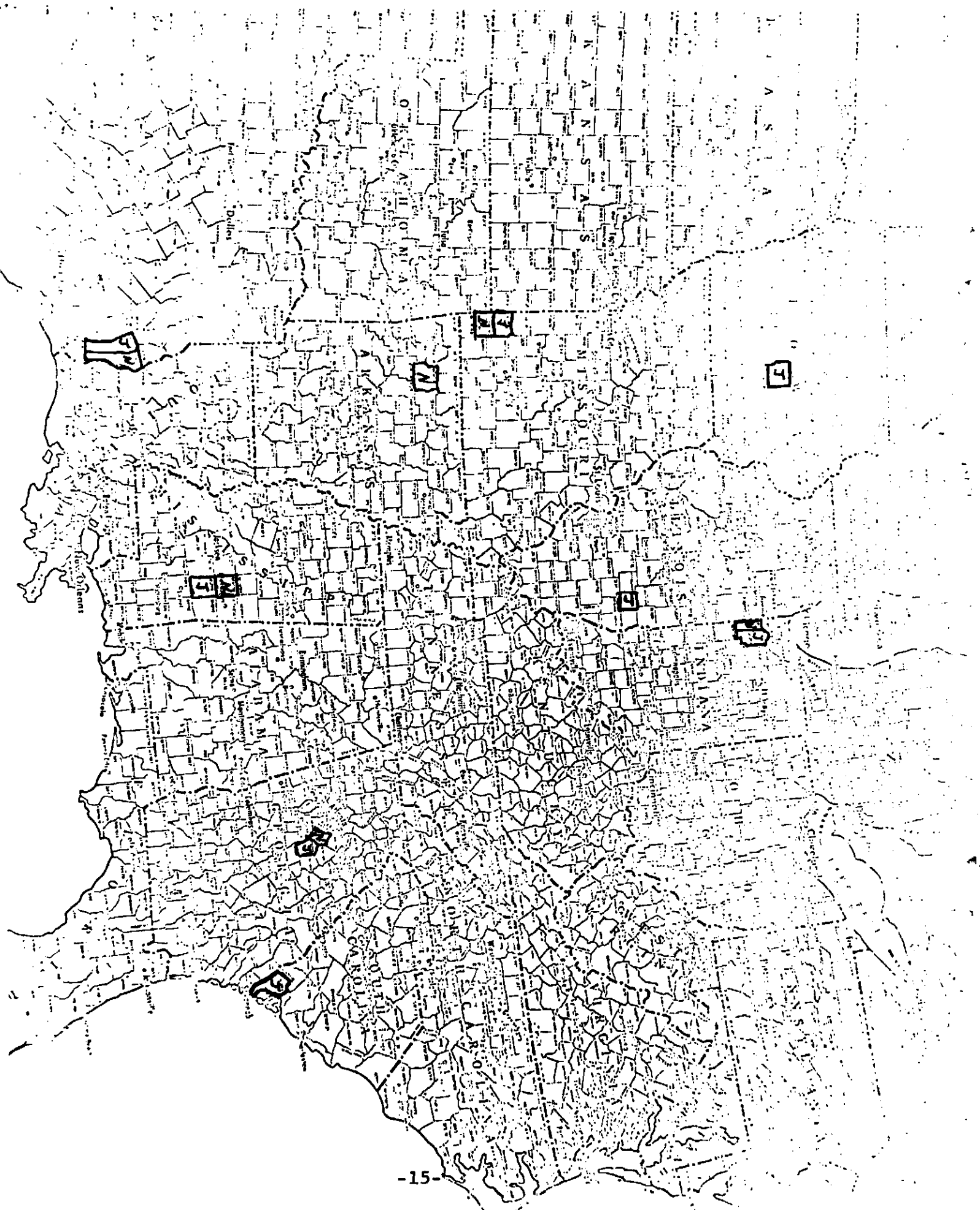

The old "Courthouse burned down" story is really true! The History Commission office, has only one roll of microfilm of tax records 1841-1867, a few cemetery records, and the Census record.

If you are interested - I would like some help. If you live in Pulaski County, or Perry County, (or anywhere else) and can help, and would be willing to search for unpublished records (I am thinking primarily of Bible records, clippings, etc.) then let's unite our efforts and get the Perry County information out into the open.

THE FARMER FAMILY ORGANIZATION

Long before "Roots" was in the process of being introduced to the public, in the form of a movie, W. L. Farmer; Wm. Claude Hale; Buck Ford and several others were leaving no stones unturned in their search of the history of their forebearers, their ancestors, The Farmers.

Fruits of their search started with two, of five brothers and one sister. Facts have been authenticated on the two brothers, Giles Emory Farmer and Marida Valentine Farmer.

This family of early Farmers were all borne in Roane County, TN in the 1820's.

The order of their birth is as follows:

- (1) Giles Emory Farmer was born on 7 March 1821.
- (2) Andrew Jackson Farmer was born on 6 March 1825.
- (3) Benjamin F. Farmer, it is considered, in 1828.
- (4) Marida Valentine Farmer, it is considered, in 1831, and,
- (5) Nansa Jane Farmer, we have nothing, even considered as to the date of her birth.

Giles Emory Farmer married Telitha Hodges and to them were born sons in Itawamba, Co., Miss. 1) Charles Owens Farmer was born on 22 March 1845 2) Benjamin Stephen Farmer was born on 29 June 1847. 3) Marion Elisha Farmer was born on 26 April 1849.

Then the Family moved to Marion County, Ala., where three sons, a daughter, and another son were born. They were: Henderson Newton Farmer, born 26 March 1852. 5) William James Farmer was born on 20 November 1854. 6) Samuel Adams Farmer was born 29 May 1857. 7) Narcissus Caroline Farmer, was born 29 September 1859, and number 8) Thomas Jefferson Farmer was born 11 October 1861.

Telitha died giving birth to Thomas Jefferson and on her death bed requested that her husband, Giles Emory Farmer, marry her widowed sister, Caroline (Hodges) Raper, who had three children. Telitha wanted Caroline to become a mother to her eight children and Emory Giles Farmer to be a father to Caroline's three. They were married and to them were born three daughters. 9) KISSIA Farmer, 10) Peleney Jerusia Farmer and number eleven was Nancy Jane Farmer.

Kissia was born in Marion County, Ala. Peleney Jerusia was born in Cape Girardeau, MO. Then the family moved and settled in CRAWFORD and WASHINGTON Counties, Arkansas, where Nancy Jane was born in December 16 1871.

In Washington and Crawford Counties, Arkansas, Giles Emory Farmer & several sons homesteaded and settled. Charles Owen Farmer married Ann Rogers, 11 June 1871, and to them were born ten children. The youngest Millie Perlina (FARMER) Mooney, is still living in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

The first annual FARMER Family Organization, Reunion was held in Oklahoma City on 23 & 24 June 1977, where many descendants of several of Giles Emory and Marida V. Farmer's attended, from all over the country.

The Trophy winner for the most miles traveled to attend the reunion was Joseph Summers and his wife West Linn, Oregon. Many of Charles Owen's descendants still live in or near the Prairie Grove; Fayetteville; Ft. Smith and other parts of Arkansas. Many live in other states around the country.

2) Benjamin Stephen Farmer married a Jane Armstrong and to them were born five children, who's names we know, but nothing else, for he moved back to Alabama, where he was born. Therefore, he has become a lost tribe to us. There were none of his descendants attending the reunion.

3) Marion Elisha Farmer married Josephine Carter, on February 13, 1879, & to them were born eight children. Three are still living in the Stilwell, Westville, Oklahoma area along with many other of Marion Elisha's descendants. One attended the reunion from Roy, Utah. Most of Marion Elisha's descendants are concentrated around Stilwell, Westville, Oklahoma and Northwest Arkansas area.

4) Henderson Newton Farmer married Fannie Rogers on 9 January 1881 and to them were born three children. None of which are still living. However several grand and greatgrand children were at the reunion. Most of Henderson Newton Farmer's descendants live in and around Prairie Grove, Arkansas, and Wilson, Healdton, Oklahoma areas.

5) William James Farmer married Emma Steele on December and to them were born three children. Emma died and William James married her sister, Linda Steele and to them were born two children. One of William and Emma's children is still living in Muldrow, Okla. Her name is Lida O. (Farmer) Hopkins.

William James Farmer had many grand and greatgrand children, but none attended the reunion.

6) Samuel Adams Farmer married Lucinda Rogers (related to Ann and Fannie Rogers) and to them were born six children, three of which are still living. The oldest and perhaps, the oldest of all of Giles Emory Farmer's grandchildren living, is Pearlina Maude (Farmer) Broughter at 95. Her second brother, Lee Farmer, at 90 attended the reunion and won the trophy for being the oldest one there.

The fifth child of Samuel Adams, Fred Giles Farmer, also attended the reunion from Ft. Worth, Texas, and several of his, as well as his father's grand and greatgrand children were there.

7) Narcissus Caroline Farmer married Thomas Jefferson Pope on 12 November 1882 and to them were born eight children. The oldest of the eight, Tennie Angeline (Pope) Ford is still living at 94 in Blackfoot, Idaho, but was too feeble to attend. Her 2nd sister and fifth member of the family, Rosa Anna (Pope) Leukenga is living in a Rest Home in Wichita, Kansas.

After Narcissus and Thomas Jefferson Pope's first four children were born in the Van Buren, Crawford County, Arkansas area, they moved to the Indian Territory where the other four children were born. Then they moved by covered wagons to Oklahoma Territory near what is now called Canute, OK. Many of their descendants are still living in Cheyenne, Elk City, Dell City, Cordell and other parts of Western Oklahoma. There were several of their descendants in attendance at the reunion.

8) Thomas Jefferson Farmer married Caroline Duff and to them were born three children, only two lived to become grown. One is still living in the city of Bartlesville, Oklahoma. He had no children. His name is Rufus Farmer.

9) Kissia Farmer (Giles and Carolina's first born child), married John Steele and to them were born five children. Little is known about this family, except it is believed that she moved to Mangum, Oklahoma to raise her family.

10) Peleney Jerusia Farmer married William Porter and to them was born one child that lived to be grown, and twins that only lived for three days. The one that lived, was named Clara, and she married William Porter, and to them were born ten children, most of which are still living and have families, though they are scattered throughout the country, none attended the reunion.

Marida Valentine Farmer, the other documented brother to Giles Emory Farmer, was also married two times. The first time to Elizabeth (last name unknown) and to them were born five children. Born in Alabama and Mississippi. Then Elizabeth died and Marida married Ann Bullok. To them were also born five children. The first two were born in Alabama and the others were born in Mississippi. When the seventh child was born, Marida moved his family by four covered wagons to Crawford County, Arkansas. He and his wife and one daughter and husband and child were washed away in the Crawford County, Arkansas flood of 1893. Only the daughter and her baby were ever found. The rest of those mentioned never were.

Marida Valentine and Elizabeth Farmer's children were:

- 1) Nancy Jane Farmer born in 1854 in Itawamba County, Mississippi.
- 2) Martha P. Farmer was born in 1856 in Itwamba County, Mississippi.
- 3) Sallie Celia Farmer was born 6 October 1857, in Marion County, Alabama.
- 4) William James Henry Farmer was born in 1860 in Marion County, Alabama.
- 5) Benjamin Franklin Farmer was born March 1861 in Marion County, Alabama.

Elizabeth died soon after Benjamin Franklin Farmer was born. Then Marida Farmer married Ann Bullok. The five children that were born to them were:

- 6 b) Mary Francis Farmer born 12 August 1866 in Marion County, Alabama.
- 7 b) John Thomas Farmer, born 1869 in Marion County, Alabama.

- 8 b) Virginia Alice Farmer born September 1870 in Marion County, Alabama. Then Marida moved his family by four covered wagons to Crawford County, Arkansas where two more children were born.

10 b) Brice Edward Farmer was born in February 1876, Crawford County, AR

It is not known who Nancy J. Farmer married. Martha P. Farmer married a Frank Gregor, but no children were born to them.

Sally Celia Farmer married John M. Carter on 25 November 1877.

William 'Jim' Henry Farmer, (nothing more has been learned about him)

Benjamin Franklin Farmer married Anne McNeil in 1891.

Mary Francis Farmer married Robert Andrews and several of their descendants were at the reunion.

John Thomas Farmer married a woman by the name of Susan. (Her last name is unknown).

Virginia Alice Farmer married Charles W. Carter 4 December 1892. One of their daughters, Edith (Carter) Owens attended the reunion.

America Caledonia "Callie" Farmer married John Atkins.

Brice Edward Farmer married Rosy Wood and they had thirteen children. There were several of Marida Valentine Farmer's descendants at the reunion

Those attending the reunion voted to make it an annual affair and, to be held in different locations of the country each year. The next one to be held in Prairie Grove, Washington County, Arkansas on 23, 24, & 25 June 1978.

The following offices were voted to be filled by: President, W. L. FARMER of Box 124, Colo. 81122. Vice President, Buck Ford of 3029 N. W. 11th Street., Oklahoma City, OK 73107. Secretary, Ida Lee Farmer, of 332 Walnut Ave., Grand Junction, Colo., 81501. Treasurer, Martha Patrick of 504 S. E. 1st St., Wilson, Oklahoma 73463.

The name, "Farmer Family Organization" was chosen as their title and \$18.00 per year per family, for membership fees and Quarterly "News Letter". Anyone interested in becoming a member should contact one of the officers.

One of the several featured speakers was Francis E. Parker, a thirty six year genealogist searching the Farmer Family History. She came from Rosemead, California.

Another speaker, Marvin Ford, (oldest of Narcissus Caroline's grandchildren), gave a good description of the kind of people the early Farmers were and expressed how proud he was to be a descendant of them. Some of his expressions were, "My mother, Tennie Angeline (Pope) Ford has told me that she never saw her mother angry, but one time in her life, and that was only slightly soo... They were of those rare people that did all within their power to live the, "True Christian Life". Their word was their bond and they would travel miles to keep that word, even if it meant traveling by foot to keep it."

"They had no welfare programs, they had provided for their own. There were no modern day conveniences, that we have to enjoy and take for granted today. There was no electricity, no indoor toilets or baths, no radios, T. Vs, daily, or even weekly newspapers, no tractors, power saws, lumber mills, power hay bailing equipment, or automatic farm harvesting equipment of any kind."

"They believed the Ten Commandments" and it showed in their lives. They loved their God. They loved their neighbors and were always ready with a helping hand to those in need."

"Few were those that had an education. It was of no need, to till the soil or build a log cabin, fall a tree in a certain spot, or, for any of the circumstances that developed. Seldom were the times a doctor was summoned but many times a mother, grandmother, or even a stranger, did the duties of a doctor in rendering aid to the sick or needy".

"Few had money. A Preacher, or doctor, might be paid with a pig, chickens, canned fruit, meat, or canned vegetables or, whatever his needs might demand. Doing chore was a must and each member of a family had his, or her's, to do and they knew to do it and do it well, with little or no complaints. A stern look from the father of the family derived more results, affection, obedience and sure action than a swat of the present

day parent. A child never had to be told more than once to do this or that. He knew the ending results if he had to be told the second time." "Yes, I am proud to be a descendent of those wonderful People". Marvin Ford quoted.

A good time was surely had by all at this first Farmer Family Reunion and we shall all be looking forward to being together again on the 23, 24 and 25th of June 1978 in Prairie Grove, Arkansas and hope to increase our attendance next year and future years. Written by Buck Ford.

BARETT ten miles northeast of Lebanon, TN., on Rock Creek, the emigrants seeking a new home in the new State of Arkansas. They traveled over a Military Road from Memphis to Batesville. Then followed a country trail to the mouth of Buffalo River. Stopping in the Buffalo-Tomahawk Section in December 1845.

Included in the Group were three brothers: Joshua; Peter; and Asa Reeves, and their half-brother, John REEVES.

Joshua REEVES was married to Mahala GRINDER and a son Bob REEVES (Uncle Bob) was b. to them 20 July 1845, a short time before the Wagon Train left Tennessee. This family stopped at Keeling Spring on Tomahawk. In 1848, Joshua and family moved to Texas to grow cotton, where Mahala died in 1849, and is buried at Belton, TX. Joshua and his children then returned to Arkansas, by way of Fort Smith and Springfield, MO. He soon married again - the children were not popular with the new wife and they went to make their home with David BARNETT and wife, who reared Uncle Bob REEVES along with their own family.

Peter REEVES, who had married Katie GRINDER, sister of Mahala, settled with his family on Buffalo River, taking a Government Patent on the land along the North side of the River where U. S. Highway #65 North Bridges Buffalo. Their home was in the Joel Baker Hollow at a point just north of where Highway # 65 now leaves the Valley. Fletcher REEVES and James REEVES were sons of Peter. There were two daughters: Louisa who married Cass McKINNEY, and Jane who married Andy McKINNEY. Fletcher REEVES was the father of REDIN REEVES and Tennessee REEVES who married John Henry BARNETT.

Asa REEVES settled on Silver Hill.

The half-brother, John REEVES patented the lands along Bear Creek, known now as the Dan Peek Place. There were two children: Bruin & Cynthia

Included in the Wagon Train was Aunt Becky BAKER, mother of Jessie, John RILEY, and Redin BAKER and Aunt Sarah HAYS. Aunt Becky was the sister of Joshua, Asa, and Peter REEVES.

Another sister of Aunt Becky's married a BAKER, the father of Jasper

REEVES and Calvin BAKER. They settled on Bear Creek in the present GRINDERS Baker Hollow Community. This may account for the first county seat of Searcy Co., AR located in the Baker Hollow BARNETT area. Clay TKSLEY'S mother and Jeff STEPHENSON'S mother (Con't) were sisters of Jasper and Calvin BAKER. Therefore, the mother of Jasper and Calvin BAKER and also the Grandmother of Clay HENSLEY and Jeff STEPHENSON, on the Baker side - the mother of Jessie, John RILEY, and Redin BAKER and Aunt Sarah HAYS were sisters of Joshua, Peter, and Asa REEVES.

The Wagon Train from Tennessee carried several unmarried young people including Margaret F. (Flurry) GRINDER, her brother Bob GRINDER, and David BARNETT. No direct kinsman of David BARNETT, emigrated from Tennessee, at this time. Bob GRINDER later became the father of George GRINDER.

Shortly after reaching Arkansas, David Barnett, patented lands along Dry Creek and married Flurry GRINDER. It has been noted above that Bob REEVES made his home with David BARNETT, after he was five years of age. He was a nephew of Flurry and a first cousin to the following children, born to David and Flurry BARNETT: Nancy, b. 25 April 1853; James Perry, b. 14 October 1855; William J. (Uncle Jack) b. 5 March 1857, d. 1 Sept. 1940? Robert M., born 11 February 1861; David O., b. 9 August 1864; Samuel S. (Uncle Siegel) b. 19 April 1866; John Henry, b. 29 March 1869; Martha E., b. 25 Sept. 1871; and Mary O., b. 9 January 1873?, died 3 Sept. 1952.

When the Civil War broke out, David BARNETT went to Springfield, MO to join the Union Army, later, Bob REEVES and James REEVES, Peter's son, slipped away under cover of night, and made their way also to Springfield, to fight with the Federal forces. Was a reprisal by the Confederates. Joshua, Bob's father, and Peter, were taken away in a chain gang. Joshua was released some six months later, but Peter was never heard of again. Later Bob REEVES and Siegel BARNETT became famous as Hunters of Wild Game. It was their responsibility to furnish the large family with meat of Deer and Turkey, and it is said they always kept a good supply of meat on hand.

After Flurry passed away in 1878, David married Sarah Jane CROSS in 1879. One son was born to this marriage... Noah, b. 10 April 1880.

David BARNETT'S third marriage was to Cynthia REEVES in the early 1880's, to this union was born two sons: Granville H. (or M.) (Uncle Murph), b. 21 May 1884; and Absalom A. (Uncle Drew), b. 27 January, 1886.

David BARRETT passed away, 3 March 1915 and Cynthia, passed on 15 June 1934.

 was owned jointly by Samuel B. GOOCH, and John MORRISON. Monroe Co. Court-
 house, Waterloo, Ill. Recorded in (Book H, pages 351-352) Witnesses were
 William DUNN, and James DUSENBERRY, appeared before Justice of Peace, J. A.
 TALBOTT, filed Sept. 28, 1844. On Oct. 30th 1844, Samuel B. GOOCH, and
 wife Tabitha (POSTON) GOOCH, borrowed \$50. from Nathan KINNEY, and put up
 their part of the land as collateral. It was to be paid back by Oct. 16,
 1849 with interest at 12% half yearly. We do not know what transpired
 but on March 6th 1851 Nathan KINNEY released the Mortgaged property stat-
 ing he had received satisfaction. (Book I pages 15-16). However we find
 another document executed before, Justice of Peace; W. C. MOORE, that on
 May 28th 1848 that their one half of this land called Lot one, containing
 one hundred and fifty acres is sold by Samuel B. & Tabitha GOOCH for
 \$150.00 to Augustus LANIER.

On March 15th 1854 Tabitha GOOCH married John DOWLIN. She appeared
 in Probate Court May 13, 1872 as John DOWLIN died Feb. 2, 1872.

On the 21st of January 1873, David DRURY GOOCH; son of Samuel, and
 Tabitha GOOCH appeared in Probate Court to settle his mother's Estate who
 died on or about 7th Jan. 1873. David appointed, Administrator, being
 over 21 years of age; other children left were: Fernetta DOWLIN, aged 17;
 and John Thomas DOWLIN, aged 15.

David Drury GOOCH settled in Van Buren Co., Arkansas on land (80
 acres) on Public Domain, and granted to him under the Presidency of

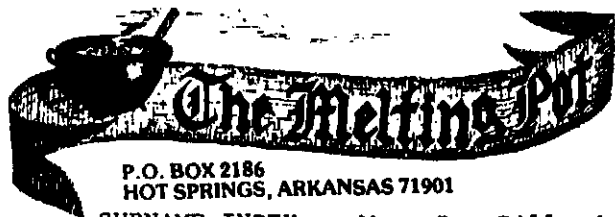

COLLINS, DREW COUNTY, ARKANSAS
By Graham Stevens Collins, Jr.

EDITOR'S NOTE: The following was contibuted by Graham Stevens Collins, Jr., 1205 Lakeshore Dr., North Little Rock, AR 72116.

Collins, Arkansas, was established as a settlement in 1856 by Benjamin Franklin Collins, according to Dr. A. O. Collins in "The Story of Moses Collins, 1785-1958, and His Descendants." B. F. Collins had extensive holdings of land, and gave land for the town's business district, Cemetery, and Baptist Church.

(B. F. Collins, was the eldest son of Moses Collins of Tippah Co., Mississippi, and was the brother of this writer's great great grandfather Elijah Walker Collins. Moses Collins founded New Albany, Mississippi, now the county seat of Union County. In B. F. Collins' time, New Albany, was in Tippah County, Miss., and it was from there that he moved to Drew Co., Arkansas).

The settlement of Collins became a small town on August 1, 1892. Residents of Collins had presented Drew County Judge Eli K. Haynes (an E. H. Haynes served with Benjamin Franklin Collins in the 14th and Confederate sessions of the Arkansas General Assembly as representatives from Drew Co.) with petitions signed by 30 men who lived in the corporate limits.

A small plat was submitted showing the would-be-town to be square-shaped, and divided into nine equal portions of land. None of the land was identified by owner.

Those who signed the petition to make Collins a town were: F. M. Campster; H. L. Biggs; J. S. Courtney; S. R. Bullock; J. F. Donaldson; M. F. Christmas; N. H. Evans; Thomas Ross; Robert Duncan; J. H. Wallace; J. E. Bowden; M. S. Collins (this was probably Moses Sumter Collins, a grandson of Collins' founder), D. S. Lovett; W. A. Graham; J. P. Weatherall; J. R. Spivey; W. B. Crenshan; R. H. Russell; W. A. Courtney; C. E. Bullock; F. H. Biggs; C. E. Gannaway; J. F. Norman; J. A. Trice; J. A. Weatherall; Jas. Gaster; J. C. Morris; W. J. Bailey; F. R. Trotter; and J. T. Blanks.

James E. Hogue was attorney for the petitioners.

Upon presentation of the petition and the plat, the papers were filed 23 May 1892, by Clerk R. L. Hardy. The Court order declaring Collins, a town was recorded and filed 15 August 1892, and signed by: J. H. Hammock and L. E. Hoke. The papers were filed with Secretary of State, Ben B. Chisum on 2 September 1892. The final writing on the papers is the name of E. B. Jett, Clerk for the Secretary of State.

Although Collins has been an inactive town for a number of years, the papers are currently on file in the Secretary of State's office.
