FOREST PLAY SHOPPE

Forest Play Shoppes are weekly outdoor adventure play groups built around the same core concepts you find behind all of our free Parent Education programs. Gather with other grownups who welcome you by name while your child delights in jumping, climbing, finding, tugging, digging, balancing, sharing, tossing, gathering, planning; always surrounded by nature's sensory delights: the crunch of snow, the smell of a pine grove, the feeling of slipping and balancing on an icy surface, the chatter of the birds, the lure of the woods in Winter.

In Forest Play Shoppes, adults and children embrace rain, snow, sunshine, wind, and mud (definitely mud!). We'll gather each week with weather appropriate clothing (some clothing to protect you and your child from moisture and cold may be provided).

Forest Play Shoppes are planned to minimize Covid-19 risks: activities are always outdoors and adults are required to wear masks at all times and to observe 6 foot distances.

La Crosse Birth-to-3 Program

A great deal of learning takes place in a child's first three years. Families who have children with developmental delays or disabilities may need extra support to help their children reach their potential. The Birth to Three Program offers free evaluations for children ages 0–3 years old.

Family Navigation Specialist

The Family Navigation Specialist works with families in La Crosse and Monroe counties when a Functional Screen needs to be completed for a child. Many programs in Wisconsin that provide supports and services for children with special needs require that a functional screen be completed to determine eligibility. Examples include: the CLTS Waiver Program, the Children's Community Options Program (CCOP), Comprehensive Community Services (CCS), among others. The Functional Screen is a screening tool that collects information on your child's health, need for supports and how they play and interact with others. The Family Navigation Specialist meets with families, either virtually or in your own home, and asks questions about your child. The staff will then complete a screening tool that will determine your child's program eligibility.

Statistics have shown that people who receive high quality CPR have a better chance of surviving a sudden cardiac event. In this three hour in-person videobased training, participants will learn infant, child, and adult CPR along with how to use an AED for all ages. The training also covers techniques to help a choking individual. Registration for this class starts the week before the training and is open to the first 8 people who register and pay, once those spots are full a waitlist will be started.

Abusive Head Trauma Prevention and Sudden Infant Death Syndrome Prevention

Crying is an infant or toddler's main method of communicating their needs. Do you have a plan for when it becomes overwhelming? Shaken Baby Syndrome is one form of Abusive Head Trauma (AHT). AHT includes injury to the brain, skull or spinal cord, as a result of shaking a child or inflicting trauma to the head which can occur when a caregiver reaches their breaking point. In this combined training, participants will also learn strategies to prevent Sudden Infant Death Syndrome. There are things that parents and caregivers can do to reduce the risk of a SIDS death. Join us to learn skills and strategies to help prevent two causes of injury and death in young children.
