

1. Introduction

This is a comprehensive finding guide to the John F. Kennedy Assassination materials in the Texas/Dallas History & Archives Division¹ of the Dallas Public Library. The materials include items in two collections. The main collection is MA88.17, the John F. Kennedy Assassination Collection. The second collection discussed is MA93.5, the *Dallas Times Herald* Kennedy Photo Collection. The sections of the guide are briefly described here.

Links and internet resources (Section 2)—This is an annotated list of Internet resources relating to John F. Kennedy and the assassination. This is not a comprehensive list.

Bibliographies (Section 3)—This is an annotated list of bibliographies relating to Kennedy and the assassination. The bibliographies are cataloged and shelved with the Texas/Dallas History & Archives Division reference collection and can be retrieved by Texas/Dallas History staff. This is not a comprehensive list, and new items are regularly added. Researchers may use the library's online catalog to search for current materials relating to the Kennedy assassination.

John F. Kennedy assassination related periodicals (Section 4)—This includes the Dallas Public Library's holdings of assassination related magazines and journals. The magazines are shelved with the JFK Assassination Collection and must be retrieved by staff members.

Magazine and journal articles (Section 5)—The JFK Assassination Collection contains copies of over 600 articles from news magazines and scholarly journals. The list included here is arranged by subject, with a list of subjects provided at the front of the section. The subject headings correspond to the news clippings headings (see below). The articles are filed alphabetically by the author and must be retrieved by a Texas/Dallas History staff member.

Microfilm collections (Section 6)—The Dallas Public Library owns microfilm sets of documents from the Warren Commission (Documents, Key Persons files, and other persons files), the Garrison investigation, the Dallas Times Herald morgue files, and various commercially published document collections. The microfilm sets are shelved with the JFK Assassination Collection in the closed stacks and must be retrieved by a Texas/Dallas History staff member.

News clippings and vertical files (Section 7)—These include clippings pertaining to the assassination from the *Dallas Morning News*, *Dallas Times Herald*, *New York Times*, and other sources. The clippings are filed in the JFK file cabinet in the closed stacks and must be retrieved by a Texas/Dallas History staff member.

¹ The Texas/Dallas History & Archives Division will afterwards be referred to as the Texas/Dallas History.

1. Introduction

Magazines (Section 8)—This portion of the collection includes magazines either devoted to Kennedy or that include a cover story relating to Kennedy. These items are shelved with the JFK Assassination Collection in the closed stacks. They must be retrieved by a Texas/Dallas History staff member.

Photographs (Section 9)—The photographs consist of two separate groups of images.

- ❖ The *Dallas Times Herald* Kennedy Photo Collection (MA93.5) is available to browse, but the Dallas Public Library *does not own the copyright* to these materials. Most of the images are owned by the Sixth Floor Museum. The photographs are in the third (right) JFK file cabinet. For more information about these photographs, please see the register for the collection: *Dallas Times Herald—Kennedy Photographs*.
- ❖ The Kennedy photographs series of the JFK Assassination Collection (MA 88.17) consists of about 75 photographs, some of unknown origin. Many of these photographs were donated by Jack Alper, with all rights owned by the Dallas Public Library. The photographs are housed in two boxes and shelved with the JFK Assassination Collection in the closed stacks. Please ask a Texas/Dallas History staff member to retrieve photographs for you.

There are more photographs relating to the JFK assassination and owned by the Dallas Public Library, housed in various collections that are part of the Texas/Dallas History photograph collections. Many of these are available through the library catalog.

Miscellaneous and ephemera (Section 10)—This is the "everything else" portion of the collection. It includes some government reports, unpublished manuscripts, scrapbooks, posters, and other assorted items. These materials are stored on the JFK Assassination Collection shelves in the closed stacks; most are in labeled boxes. Please ask a staff member if you would like to see materials in this part of the collection.

Books about the John F. Kennedy assassination (Section 11)—In this section are three lists of books concerning the assassination, theories about involvement in the assassination, and other assassination-related publications. The lists include books owned by the Texas/Dallas History division that are found in both the JFK Assassination collection and in the reference section of the archives as well as titles that the library has not been able to acquire. The first list is arranged by item numbers and is found in the JFK Assassination manuscript collection. The second list includes books that are found in the reference section of the Texas/Dallas History division. The third list are titles, for further reading and research, that are not owned by the Dallas Public Library.

Audio and video materials related to the John F. Kennedy assassination (Section 12)—Dallas Public Library and Texas/Dallas History owns several recorded audio and video items concerning the assassination. These include commercial publications, fictional works, documentaries, recordings of speeches, and other materials. A list of all the audio and video items is provided in subsection 12.1, in alphabetical order by title, and a list of the numbered videocassettes and DVD in the collection are provided in subsection 12.2.

He offers a host of documents and writings, including his two monographs on neutron-activation of the bullets and fragments and on the physics of JFK's movements after the fatal headshot. There is no search feature, and the site is displayed in frames.

This searchable site provides an overview of the activities of the independent federal agency called the Assassination Records Review Board (ARRB), established under the provisions of the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992. The board was to acquire records not in the National Archives and Records Administration collections and to review decisions about releasing assassination-related records. Records identified and collected by the ARRB have been transferred to the National Archives.

CTKA: Citizens for Truth about the Kennedy Assassination

Organized in 1993, CTKA (now called Kennedys and King) aims to push for the release of all records pertaining to the JFK assassination. CTKA published the now defunct magazine, Probe. The site includes a full archive of the magazine and publishes new articles.

The Cuban Information Archive is designed to serve the Cuban exile community, primarily in South Florida. The JFK menu looks at the efforts purported to have been made by the Cuban government to use the JFK assassination to discredit the U.S.

This site includes a tour of evidence (from the National Archives and FBI) used by JFK researcher John Armstrong. Also included are speeches and articles prepared by Armstrong on his theory of Oswald being an amalgamation of two individuals. The site was last updated in April 2005.

This site, run by Rex Bradford, seeks to "shed needed light on the darker aspects of post-World War II American politics" through the release of documents related to the assassination. The site also includes contributed essays from assassination researchers.

It Was Johnson: The US media's greatest betrayal of the public trust

This site covers the assassination as a political coup by then Vice President Lyndon Johnson. The publisher and editor of the site is given only as Impious Digest. The site is organized as a report presenting support for the point of view of the author. It includes information about secret societies such as the Ku Klux Klan and the Freemasons.

JFK Lancer was created in 1995 by Thomas A. Jones and Debra J. Conway. The organization sponsors an annual meeting, "November in Dallas." Their website gives ticket information about upcoming meetings as well as a link to YouTube videos on their YouTube channel.

This website is provided by David A. Reitzes, an independent researcher. The site offers original essays by Reitzes; copies of selected documents; information about the Jim Garrison investigation, Oliver Stone's *JFK*, and Nigel Turner's *The Men Who Killed Kennedy*; and reviews of various books. The site also includes Reitzes' original website. It is important to note that Reitzes started his research believing in a conspiracy and the "two Oswalds" theory, but now questions them.

John F. Kennedy Presidential Library and Museum

This is the website of Kennedy's Presidential Library, administered by the National Archives. The library was dedicated on 20 October 1979, and its purpose is to "advance the study and understanding of President Kennedy's life and career and the times in which he lived; and to promote a greater appreciation of America's political and cultural heritage, the process of governing and the importance of public service."

Kennedy Assassination Home Page

This site, offered by John McAdams, is "dedicated to debunking the mass of misinformation and disinformation surrounding the murder of JFK." The author claims that the site will appeal to the "sophisticated conspiracist" and those who believe in the lone gunman theory, but not others. McAdams explores several issues related to the assassination and includes much photographic and documentary evidence. Also included are several articles by other authors, some contrary to McAdams' beliefs, and links to other sites. The site is searchable.

This website is dedicated to carrying on the legacy of researcher extraordinaire Mary Ferrell. The site avers that this is the largest searchable collection of material related to the assassination. Among the items available are over 400,000 pages of reports and documents, hundreds of books, over 300 essays, back issues of JFK journals, and commentary by other researchers. Material from Ferrell's personal archive are supplemented by donations from the Assassination Archives and Research Center and History Matters. Searching requires a paid subscription, but browsing the collection is free.

Office of the City Secretary, Dallas Municipal Archives: The John F. Kennedy Collection

This is the site of the Dallas Municipal Archives holdings on the assassination. The collection consists primarily of the Dallas Police Department records, which were made available in 1989. More than 11,000 documents from the collection are available online.

Sixth Floor Museum





6.3. The FBI Files on the Assassination of President Kennedy

In December 1977 and January 1978, under guidelines provided by the Freedom of Information Act, the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) released over 90,000 pages of documentation covering its investigation of the Kennedy assassination. The released documents were soon reproduced on microfilm by the Microfilming Corporation of America.² This set of microfilm is the full set produced by that company. All released materials except newspaper clippings were microfilmed.

The microfilm is arranged in four series:

Series I. John F. Kennedy Series II. Lee Harvey Oswald Series III. Jack Leon Ruby Series IV. Warren Commission

Additional descriptions of these series are available in the finding guide accompanying the microfilm set, a copy of which is at the Texas/Dallas History reference desk. It is important to note that the materials were microfilmed in the same order as filed by the FBI, arranged by type and size. Items that are letter or legal size are generally in chronological order. Larger items are designated as Enclosure Behind File (EBF) items and are included at the end of the chronological materials. The contents of each reel are given below. 6.4. Garrison Investigation, 1966 – 1973

The following description of the collection is reproduced verbatim from the guide and inventory provided with the microfilm of this collection, and the text is also available online from the New Orleans Public Library (http://www.nutrias.org/~nopl/inv/jfk.htm).

Orleans Parish (La.) District Attorney's Office

Materials relating to the investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, the trial of Clay Shaw, and related matters, 1966 - 1973.

These documents were deposited in the City Archives Collection in 1990 along with the DA's case files for the period 1950 – 1969.

The records include materials apparently collected by DA Jim Garrison and his staff during their investigation of the Kennedy assassination; photocopies of portions of the court record in the case of Louisiana vs Clay Shaw and other cases related to the investigation; correspondence files; and a file of miscellaneous material. The inventory attached to this description lists individual folder titles within the series.

The correspondence sub-series includes general correspondence of the DA's Office for the period as well as letters dealing specifically with the assassination investigation. Many of the letters that are relevant to the assassination are in the nature of "fan mail" (i.e., letters of congratulation and/or encouragement; requests for Garrison to speak to various groups; and the like). There are letters of more substance: letters to & from reporters & other representatives of the news media (including one from Rosemary James) and letters from people throughout the country offering their own assassination theories and/commenting on Garrison's are two of the larger categories.

Other interesting/significant items or groups of items are:

- correspondence from mid-1967 concerning complaints lodged with the state bar association against Garrison by attorneys representing witnesses in the Clay Shaw case.
- copy of a letter from Garrison to Marina [Oswald] Porter [February 20, 1968].
- ❖ telegram [May 30, 1968] from Mrs. Marguerite Oswald.
- memo from Garrison to Asst. DA James Alcock [December 11, 1967] concerning the David Ferrie autopsy.
- ♦ letter from Garrison to F. Irvin Dymond [May 24, 1967] concerning details of the case.
- ❖ letters to and from such figures/organizations as Melvin Belli and the Bertrand Russell Peace Foundation.

A "landmark" letter is the first one in the correspondence sub-series—Garrison's January 3, 1966, letter to the Government Printing Office in Washington ordering a set of the Warren Commission report for use in the DA's Office. In addition to the general correspondence sub-series there is another group of letters concerning the defense [by the law firm of Deutsch, Kerrigan, and Stiles] of Garrison's co-defendants in the Shaw vs. Garrison, et al. case.

The sub-series of "miscellaneous" materials has been left as it came into the archives. Included are clippings from various publications, some dealing with the Kennedy family, some with occult phenomena, and some seemingly unrelated to the assassination investigation. At least some of these materials appear to have once been kept in a scrapbook.

By no means does this series constitute a complete record of the Garrison case. It does, however, contain numerous interesting and possibly important documents relative to the investigation and subsequent trial.

Numbered Documents of the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy (Microfilm Publication M1124)

The following text is provided verbatim from the National Archives and Records Service Microfilm Publication M1124. The publication includes a brief description of this 42-roll microfilm set, and an index of the document numbers contained on each roll.

Introduction

On the 42 rolls of this microfilm publication is reproduced a series of approximately 1,550 numbered documents of the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy that the Commission regarded as "basic source materials" for its investigation. These documents are part of Records of the President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy, Record Group (RG) 272. A list of the Commission documents (CDs) is reproduced at the beginning of roll 1. They were accumulated by the Commission between December 1963 and November 1964, but some are dated earlier.

Background

The President's Commission on the Assassination of President Kennedy, commonly called the Warren Commission from the name of its chairman, was appointed by President Lyndon B. Johnson by Executive Order 11130, dated November 29, 1963. Its purpose was to investigate the November 22, 1963, assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy in Dallas, Texas. The President directed the Commission to evaluate and report on matters relating to the assassination and the subsequent killing of the alleged assassin.

The following seven men were appointed to the Commission:

Earl Warren—Chairman: Chief Justice of the United States, former Governor, and attorney general of California.

Richard B. Russell: Democratic Senator from Georgia and chairman of the Senate Armed Services Committee, former Governor of Georgia, and county attorney in that State.

John Sherman Cooper: Republican Senator from Kentucky, former county and circuit judge in Kentucky, and U. S. Ambassador to India.

Hale Boggs: Democratic Representative from Louisiana and majority whip in the House of Representatives.

Gerald R. Ford: Republican Representative from Michigan and chairman of the House Republican Conference.

Allen W. Dulles: lawyer and former Director of the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA).

John J. McCloy: lawyer, former President of the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, and former U. S. High Commissioner for Germany.




