- The judicial branch consists of a system of courts that interpret and apply the civil and criminal laws of the state.
- House Bill 584 is the appropriation bill for the Judiciary for FY22.







Jefferson Parish Precincts in the Sixth Louisiana Supreme Court District are Caldwell 1-G1; 1-LA, I-LB; 2-L; 182 through 185; 189 through 197; and 246A through 250. Winn Jefferson Parish Precincts in the Seventh Louisiana Supreme Court District are 1-G; 2-G through 11-G; 1-W through 9-W; 156; 171 through 181; 187; 188; 210 through 217; and 225 through 238. Orleans Parish Precincts in the First Louisiana Supreme Court District are 3-20; 4-8 through 4-11; 4-14 through 4-23; 5-13 through 5-18; and 17-17 through 17-21. The remainder of Orleans Parish Precincts are in the Seventh Louisiana Supreme Court District. Charles

The Supreme Court is the highest court and court of last resort in the state.

Among other responsibilities, it has exclusive appellate jurisdiction over questions of unconstitutionality and death penalty appeals, and regular appellate jurisdiction from the Courts of Appeals.



### FY22 Judicial Budget Louisiana Courts of Appeal Districts




Courts of Appeal in Louisiana serve as intermediate courts, hearing appeals from the district court level.

In general, these courts have appellate jurisdiction over all civil matters, all family and juvenile courts, and most criminal cases that are tried by jury.

Judicial terms on the courts of appeal are ten years.



# FY22 Judicial Budget Louisiana District Courts Judicial Districts



Louisiana has 42 judicial districts, each with its own district court.

Each district covers at least one parish and has at least one district judge. Each district elects a chief judge.

In general, these courts have original jurisdiction over all civil and criminal matters. They exclusively handle original jurisdiction in felony matters and most cases involving property.

Judicial terms on district courts are six years.




### FY22 Judicial Budget Changes in Funding since FY16



### FY22 Judicial Budget Means of Finance



#### **Non-SGF Sources of Funding:**

**Statutory Dedications** are from the Judges' Supplemental Compensation Fund and the Trial Court Case Management Information Fund.

**Interagency Transfer** funding comes from the Department of Children and Family Services from the Federal Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) block grant. The amounts transferred include \$5.4 million for Drug Courts and \$3.99 million for Court Appointed Special Advocates (CASA).
