Continuing Projects

- Report ED data from syndromic surveillance "chief complaint" data on suspected drug overdoses.
- Work with coroners and toxicology labs to collect descriptions of drug overdose death circumstances; report to CDC and disseminate trends through BHI data products
- Funds directed to NMS Labs for comprehensive toxicology testing on behalf of 56 parish coroners.
- Continuation of death, injury, and healthcare utilization data on LODSS (https://lodss.ldh.la.gov)











OD₂A Surveillance Activities

New Projects

- Examine the associations between opioid morbidity and mortality with social, psychological, and environmental factors in Louisiana
- Publish more detailed summary data on the demographics of opioid prescription data
- More analysis of toxicology data types and combinations of drugs used
- Evaluation of reported drug specificity before and after the implementation of the LEERS "Opioid Button."
- Pilot parish-wide implementation of ODMAP in Orleans Parish






Drug-Involved Deaths in Louisiana



Opioid-involved deaths occurring in Louisiana, 2012-2018




Deaths by Specific Opioid Drugs Used—Louisiana, 2014-2018




Drug Poisoning Deaths by Region — Louisiana, 2014-2018






Hospital admissions involving opioid poisoning* and heroin poisoning by quarter** Louisiana, 2014 - 2018


Medicaid members receiving Substance Use Disorder treatment services* State Fiscal Years 2015-2018


