


CHLAMYDIA—LOUISIANA

- In 2017, **34,749** people were diagnosed with chlamydia for a rate of **742.2** per 100,000.
- In 2018, 36,293 people were diagnosed with chlamydia for a rate of 778.8 per 100,000.
- In 2019, 36,131 people were diagnosed with chalmydia for a rate of 777.2 per 100,000. The rate has remained unchanged since 2018.



CHLAMYDIA BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2017, **71%** of chlamydia diagnoses were among females, decreasing to **68%** in 2019. In 2019, **32%** of chlamydia diagnoses were among males.

CHLAMYDIA BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Black people account for 32% of Louisiana's total population.

- In 2017, 70% of chlamydia diagnoses were among Black people, increasing to 71% in 2019.
- In 2017, 26% of chlamydia diagnoses were among White people, decreasing to 24% in 2019.
- From 2017 to 2019, 4% of chlamydia diagnoses were among Hispanic/Latinx people.

CHLAMYDIA BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

The majority of chlamydia diagnoses are in people under the age of 25.

- In 2019, as in prior years, people under the age of 25 accounted for almost 70% of all chlamydia diagnoses.
- From 2017 to 2019, the proportion of diagnoses among people 25-34 years was 24%.
- From 2017 to 2019 the proportion of diagnoses among people 35 and older was just 6%.

CHLAMYDIA BY REGION

• From 2017 to 2019, the greatest proportion of chlamydia diagnoses were in the New Orleans region. In 2019, the New Orleans region had the highest chlamydia diagnosis rate in the state. In 2017 and 2018, the Monroe region had the highest rate of chlamydia diagnoses in the state.



GONORRHEA-LOUISIANA

- In 2017, **12,014** people were diagnosed with gonorrhea for a rate of **256.6** per 100,000.
- In 2018, 12,043 people were diagnosed with gonorrhea for a rate of 258.4 per 100,000.
- In 2019, 12,800 people were diagnosed with gonorrhea for a rate of 275.3 per 100,000, a 7% rate increase from 2018.



GONORRHEA BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2017, **50%** of gonorrhea diagnoses were among females. This proportion decreased to **48%** in 2019. In 2019, **52%** of gonorrhea diagnoses were among males.

GONORRHEA BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Black people account for 32% of Louisiana's population.

- In 2017, 77% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among Black people, decreasing to 75% in 2018 and to 74% in 2019.
- In 2017, 21% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among White people, increasing to 22% in 2018 and 23% in 2019.
- From 2017 to 2019, 2% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among Hispanic/Latinx people.

GONORRHEA BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

The majority of gonorrhea diagnoses are in people under the age of 25.

- The proportion of diagnoses among people under 25 years old was 58% in 2017, 55% in 2018, and 53% in 2019.
- The proportion of diagnoses among people 25-34 years was 29% in 2017, 31% in 2018, and 32% in 2019.
- The proportion of diagnoses among people 35 and older was 13% in 2017, 14% in 2017, and 16% in 2019.

GONORRHEA BY REGION

• From 2017 to 2019, the greatest proportion of gonorrhea diagnoses were in the New Orleans region. From 2017 to 2019, the New Orleans region also had the highest gonorrhea diagnosis rate in the state.



PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS—LOUISIANA

- In 2017, 679 people were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of 14.5 per 100,000.
- In 2018, 669 people were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of 14.4 per 100,000.
- In 2019, 700 people were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of 15.1 per 100,000, a 5% rate increase from 2018.



PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2017, **73%** of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among males, **75%** in 2018 and **77%** in 2019. In 2019, **23%** of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among females.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Black people account for 32% of Louisiana's population.

- In 2017, 69% of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among Black people, decreasing to 64% in 2018 and to 61% in 2019.
- In 2017, 29% of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among White people, increasing to 33% in 2018 and to 36% in 2019.
- From 2017 to 2019, 2% of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among Hispanic/Latinx people.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

The proportion of new P&S syphilis diagnoses is rising among people 35 and older.

- The proportion of diagnoses among people under 25 years old was 34% in 2017 and remained at 34% in 2019.
- The proportion of diagnoses among people 25-34 years was 40% in 2017, 42% in 2018, and 34% in 2019.
- The proportion of diagnoses among people 35 and older was 26% in 2017, 28% in 2018, and 32% in 2019.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY REGION

• From 2017 to 2019, the New Orleans region had the greatest proportion of P&S syphilis diagnoses in the state. In 2017, the Monroe region had the highest P&S syphilis diagnosis rate in Louisiana. The Alexandria region had the highest diagnosis rate in 2018 and 2019. The number of new diagnoses has tripled in Alexandria since 2017.



HIV DIAGNOSES—LOUISIANA

- In 2017, **1,014** people were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **21.6** per 100,000.
- In 2018, 974 people were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of 20.9 per 100,000.
- In 2019, **893** people were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **19.2** per 100,000, an **8%** rate decrease from 2018.



HIV DIAGNOSES BY GENDER

In 2017, **73%** of new HIV diagnoses were among males. This proportion decreased to **72%** in 2018 and increased to **76%** in 2019. In 2019, **22%** of all new diagnoses were among females. In 2017, **3%** of new HIV diagnoses were among transgender people. This proportion decreased to **2%** in 2018 and 2019.

HIV DIAGNOSES BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Black people account for 32% of Louisiana's population.

- In 2017, **69%** of HIV diagnoses were among Black people, **70%** in 2018, and **66%** in 2019.
- In 2017, 23% of HIV diagnoses were among White people, 22% in 2018, and 23% in 2019.

 In 2017, 7% of HIV diagnoses were among Hispanic/Latinx people, 6% in 2018, and 10% in 2019.

HIV DIAGNOSES BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

From 2017-2019, the majority of new HIV diagnoses were among people under 35 years old.

- The proportion of diagnoses among people 24 and under was 25% in 2017, 24% in 2018, and 21% in 2019.
- The proportion of diagnoses among people 25-34 years old was 36% in 2017, 36% in 2018, and 37% in 2019.
- The proportion of diagnoses among people 35 and older was 39% in 2017, 41% in 2018, and 42% in 2019.

HIV DIAGNOSES BY REGION

• From 2017 to 2019, the New Orleans Public Health Region had the greatest proportion of HIV diagnoses. In 2017 and 2019, the New Orleans Public Health Region had the highest HIV diagnosis rate; Baton Rouge Region in 2018.

In 2018, Louisiana ranked 3rd in the nation for Congenital Syphilis rates, 2nd for Chlamydia rates, 7th for Primary and Secondary Syphilis rates, and 5th for Gonorrhea rates. In 2018, Louisiana ranked 4th for HIV rates and 4th for AIDS rates in the US.
