## $\textbf{History}^{1,\,2}$

DeSoto, which includes land from both Caddo and Natchitoches parishes, became a parish on April 1, 1843. The name honors Hernando DeSoto, the Spanish explorer who discovered the Mississippi River in 1541. The first colonists were subjects of France and Spain, who later became citizens of the Republic of Texas. On the Sabine River, the Waterloo community seems to have existed since Louisiana became a state in 1812. The site probably shifted somewhat when Dr. Logan established the ferry crossing called Logan Port, which changed to Logansport in 1848.



Mansfield serves as the seat of government and the industrial, business, and medical center for the area. DeSoto Parish is located on the mouth of the Sabine River and at the beginning of the Toledo Bend Lake. The Louisiana Blueberry Festival is held the fourth weekend in June on the courthouse square in downtown Mansfield. River City Fest is held the first weekend in May in downtown Logansport. Duel on the Border is held in Logansport on the Toledo Bend Reservoir, in which drag boats race down the river at speeds up to 200 mph. In addition to festivals, visitors enjoy the Mansfield State Commemorative Area; the historic Rock Chapel, built in 1891; and the original Log Courthouse built in 1843. It is the only surviving courthouse of its kind in the state.
