SUBJECT: Confirmation of Telephone Call

This is to confirm the long-distance collect telephone call made by Special Agent Joseph E. Noonan, Jr., Chicago, on 12-19-63, in which SA Noonan advised ASAIC Chester J. Miller that Lloyd J. Wilson aka Dwight Allen Wilson was in the custody of the Chicago Police Department on a complaint filed by SA Noonan, and that Wilson was due to appear in Branch 42, Municipal Court of Chicago, 1121 S. State Street, Chicago, Illinois, on December 20, 1963.

ASAIC Miller was further advised that SA Noonan will request that Wilson be given a psychiatric examination by the Chicago police psychiatrist to determine his sanity and that this action is based on Wilson's statements that he intends to start his own political movement and that if President Johnson should try to interfere with him, he would see to it that President Johnson was assassinated.

This Date, 12/19/63 the Chicago Off. of the FBI interviewed Wilson, who came into the Chicago Office this A M & said he paid Oswald \$1000 to assassinate the President. He previously had contacted the Chicago Newspapers in Chicago & said he was turning himself in - Thus there is a Press Interest.

Papers on his person show he was discharged from US Airforce 12/17/63 as a Schizo-paranoid state - Wilson stated he had saved his money & with organization backing was to kill Pres. Johnson - He gave himself in to keep himself from killing Pres. Johnson. Above information given SS Office in Chicago, immediately who are investigating at once. Local Police have been contacted & given this information.

Information called this Office primarily because of possible Press Inquiries., Subject is in our file since 9/10/63 as a threatening Subject.

This report relates to an offense committed in your district against the laws relating to the protection of the President of the United States.

Violation of Section 871, Title 18, U. S. Code, to wit: that on December 19, 1963, the defendant did knowingly and willfully make a verbal threat to take the life of the President of the United States, Lyndon B. Johnson.

DETAILS OF OFFENSE

At approximately 8:45 a.m., on 12-19-63, Lloyd John Wilson telephonically contacted a Chicago newspaper to advise that he was then in the FBI building in Chicago, Illinois, and planned to surrender himself to the FBI because of his involvement in the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

Immediately thereafter Wilson was intercepted by the FBI as he was preparing to enter the Chicago office of that agency.

Later on the same date, Acting SAs Martinson, Chicago, U. S. Secret Service, was telephonically contacted by SAs Martin Johnson, FBI, and advised that the defendant had made statements which concerned the safety of the President of the United States.

On the afternoon of the same date, the defendant was interviewed by the writer and Special Agent Edward E. Tucker. The defendant was quite open in his conversation and freely stated that he had paid a man named (would) \$1000 to assassinate President John F. Kennedy. He stated also that he intended to return to the state of California where he would reinstitute a political organization of which he was the founder. This organization is called the BAI Organization or The White Resistance.

When questioned regarding his feelings concerning President Lyndon B. Johnson, the defendant stated that he did not know enough of the present President but that should President Johnson continue the same political course as President Kennedy that he, the defendant, would consider the assassination of President Johnson to be necessary for the good of the United States. The defendant was asked if he would pay to have the assassination committed by another person to which he stated that he would do so.

He stated further that he knew persons who were qualified and willing to carry out such an assassination.

The defendant was asked if he would, under any circumstances, assassinate the President of the United States himself, to which the defendant replied that although he did not like violence, if necessary he would assassinate the President of the United States. The defendant stated that his political beliefs held that assassination was an acceptable political maneuver.

The defendant generally agrees with the beliefs and aims of the American Nazi Party and although he does not identify himself with that organization, shows a tendency to follow the fascist line.

The defendant further stated that his form of government would not tolerate free speech or freedom of the press, that this form of government would allow no opposition and would have no hesitancy in killing persons who did not conform to standards of his belief.

It should be noted that this Service first began to have interest in the defendant on 9-10-63 when they were advised by the FBI that the defendant had supposedly written a letter to President Kennedy, a portion of which contained a sentence "Some day I'll meet you, you'll

know so well, if the government hasn't changed by then, I'll destroy it along with you".

The defendant was interviewed by SAIC Herman Sheridan, U. S. Secret Service, Spokane, Washington, at which time he acknowledge writing a letter to President Kennedy and admitted the threatening sentence previously listed.

The defendant executed a signed, sworn statement regarding this matter to SAIC Sheridan. A carbon copy of this statement is attached to this report. Also attached to this report is a copy of the letter the defendant had written to President Kennedy which he re wrote at SAIC Sheridan's request. In it is contained the threatening sentence to the President of the United States. This letter is in the defendant's own handwriting.

It should be noted that this letter was never sent to President Kennedy. The defendant stated that he destroyed the letter.

These last paragraphs are added to show the consistent feeling of extreme antagonism the defendant has towards the office of the President of the United States.

The defendant is a white male, 18 years of age, born 8-16-45 at Santa Cruz, California. He is single and investigation shows that he has worked at menial jobs for short periods of time. On 10-31-63, he enlisted in the

U. S. Air Force at Spokane, Washington, and was discharged as a security risk on December 13, 1963. This discharge was termed honorable; however, it was based on a report by the U. S. Secret Service advising the Air Force that the subject had previously threatened the life of President John F. Kennedy and was considered dangerous by this Service.

Examination of the subject by Air Force psychiatrists was effected prior to his discharge and he was termed as a schizophrenic person with strong paranoid tendencies.

The defendant has no known police record.

The defendant's fingerprints were taken by the FBI and to date no report has been received.

SYNOPSIS

FBI, Spokane, advised that the subject was in their Chicago office on this date and that the subject claimed he had conspired with Harvey Lee Oswald in the assassination of the President.

(A) INTRODUCTION:

Reference is made to my report dated November 7, 1963 closing the investigation at Spokane; also, to my office memorandum of November 27, 1963 to the Chief transmitting an envelope and original letter received that day from the subject with a return address of Lackland Air Force Base, Texas.

(B) GENERAL INQUIRIES

On 12-19-63 Special Agent Donald F. Head, FBI Resident Agency, Spokane, called at our office about 8:45 a.m. SA Head stated he had received a telephone call from their special agent in charge in Seattle; that the subject was in their Chicago office on this date. He further advised that the subject had called on a Chicago newspaper and claimed he had conspired with Harvey Lee Oswald in the assassination of President Kennedy. He also stated the subject had been discharged December 18, 1963 from Chamute Air Force Base, Illinois, and that the subject had said he had been interviewed by me in the Spokane office. SA Head asserted he did not know whether their Chicago office had advised the Secret Service office in Chicago. He stated their Chicago office wanted to verify my interview with the subject in Spokane.

I telephoned ASAC Martineau, Chicago, who stated the FBI had advised him that the subject was in their office. ASAC Martineau also stated he had received information from SAIC Backstrom, Springfield, that the subject received a Profile-4 discharge on December 18, 1963 from Chamute Air Force Base, Illinois.

SA Head, FBI, Spokane, returned to our office in about a half hour and stated their Chicago office wanted copies of the statement I obtained October 29, 1963 from the subject; also, a copy of the subject's letter which the subject mailed from Lackland Air Force Base, Texas. SA Head was advised that the desired copies of the subject's statement and letter should be obtained from the Chief's office or our San Francisco office. SA Head was assured of my cooperation in every way possible in this case; however, I felt inasmuch as the subject Wilson had associated himself with Harvey Lee Oswald I did not have authorization to furnish these copies and that the best source to obtain them would be through our Chief's office where the original statement and letter are filed.

I telephoned ASAC Miller, PMS, Washington, D. C. and advised him of the FBI's request. I also telephoned Assistant U. S. Attorney Carroll Gray, Spokane, who had previously been furnished a copy of the subject's statement and letter, and advised him that the FBI had been referred to our Chief's office for the above mentioned copies of the subject's statement and letter. He said SA Head of the FBI had not contacted him regarding this case and in the event he did, he would also refer him to our Chief's office for the information requested.

(J) CONCLUSION

The case remains closed at Spokane.

SYNOPSIS

Charges against the subject in State Court were dismissed at the request of the U. S. Attorney. Subject appeared before the U. S. Commissioner in Chicago. His hearing was continued until January 10, 1964. Bond was set for \$25,000.00.

On January 9, 1964, Judge Abraham L. Marovitz ordered a sanity hearing to be held on January 16, 1964.

The hearing before the U. S. Commissioner was continued pending the outcome of the sanity hearing before Judge Marovitz.

(A) INTRODUCTION:

Reference is made to the M/R of the writer dated 12-23-63 and to the M/R of SAIC Fred H. Backstrom, Springfield, dated 12-30-63.

(B) GENERAL INQUIRIES:

On 1-3-64, the subject appeared before Judge Harry G. Comerford, Branch 42a, Municipal Court of Chicago, at which time the charges pending against him were dismissed in lieu of the federal warrant and the subject was turned over to the U. S. Marshals.

On the same date, the subject appeared before U. S. Commissioner C. S. Bentley Pike, Chicago, who assigned Raymond Smith as the subject's attorney and at Mr. Smith's request continued the hearing until January 10, 1964. The Commissioner set bond at \$25,000.00

DETAILS

SYNOPSIS

This report concerns search of Lloyd John Wilson's duffle bag at Chanute Air Force Base, Illinois, and copy of his "Ode" to President Kennedy.

DETAILS OF INVESTIGATION

This investigation originated with a L/D call to Clerk Grandidier from SA Noonan, Chicago, on December 20, 1963, advising that the FBI had informed the Chicago Office that they had located Wilson's duffle bag at Chanute Air Force Base and were going to open it.

Other Law Enforcement Agencies

SA Manley Hawkes, FBI, Springfield, was contacted and stated he would have Resident Agent Eugene Irwin of their Champaign Office provide us with any pertinent information.

On December 30, 1963, SA Gerald Shanahan, FBI, Springfield, stated the duffle bag contained only personal articles of subject Wilson and that it had been found by Air Police in an alley behind the bus station at Rantoul, Illinois, which is the town immediately adjacent to Chanute Air Force Base. However, in the duffle bag was an Air Training Command "Student Study Guide and Workbook" issued at Lackland AFB, Texas.

On the outside back cover Wilson had written a dedication to President Kennedy apparently on November 22, 1963. Xerox copies were made of the front and back cover and are furnished Chief and Chicago. SA Shanahan further advised that a local Chicago Judge had committed Wilson to the Cook County Psychopathic Hospital for observation.

DISPOSITION

Case closed this District.

On 1-3-64, the writer conferred with Assistant U. S. Attorney James B. Sloan who stated that the States Attorney's Office of Illinois had advised him that the subject was examined by a psychiatrist of the Chicago Police Department and that his findings were that the subject was a pure paranoid which he considered an extremely rare occurrence and that it was his opinion that the subject was extremely dangerous.

On 1-9-64, Assistant U. S. Attorney Sloan appeared before Judge Abraham L. Marovitz, Northern District of Illinois, and requested a sanity hearing to determine if the subject was capable of answering the charges which have been placed against him. Judge Marovitz ordered the sanity hearing to be held on January 16, 1964. Judge Marovitz also ordered that the subject be examined by a psychiatrist prior to the sanity hearing on January 16, 1964.

On the same date, the writer conferred with Assistant U. S. Attorney James B. Sloan and it was ascertained that the Commissioner's hearing which was scheduled for January 10, 1964, had been continued at the request of Judge Marovitz pending the outcome of the sanity hearing on January 16, 1964.

(J) CONCLUSION:

This case is pending judicial action.

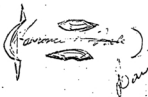

DETAILS

SYNOPSIS

Lloyd John Wilson was removed to the Medical Center for Federal Prisoners, Springfield, Missouri, on January 24, 1964 for a complete psychiatric evaluation.

This action was at the direction of Federal Judge Abraham Marovits, Chicago, who issued the order on January 16, 1964.

Assistant U.S. Attorney James B. Sloan, Chicago, has advised that he will endeavor to have Wilson returned to California for treatment in a state hospital.

(A) INTRODUCTION:

Reference is made to the writer's memorandum report dated January 21, 1964.

(I) DISPOSITION:

On January 20, 1964, Acting Special Agent in Charge Maurice G. Martineau, Chicago, received a letter from Mrs. E. Seitsinger, step-mother of Lloyd John Wilson. In this letter, Mrs. Seitsinger advised that if Wilson was convicted in court and if he was sentenced, she would like to put him in a state hospital in California.

On this same date, the subject letter was turned over to Assistant U.S. Attorney James B. Sloan, Chicago, who advised that he would personally write Mrs. Seitsinger and attempt to have Wilson committed to a

On January 30, 1964, the writer contacted the U.S. Marshal's office in Chicago, and was advised that Lloyd John Wilson was removed to the Medical Center for Federal Prisoners at Springfield, Missouri on January 24, 1964.

Attached to the original of this report is a Thermo-Fax copy of the evaluation of Lloyd John Wilson by the Psychiatric Institute of the Municipal Court of Chicago. This report is dated December 20, 1963.

Form 1609 was sent to the Medical Center for Federal Prisoners on February 11, 1964.

DETAILS

SYNOPSIS

Information received through the Federal Bureau of Investigation regarding alleged threat by a Dwight Allen Wilson, who has been identified but has not as yet been located.

(A) INTRODUCTION:

Reference is made to Office Memorandum of SAIC Hanson dated September 10, 1963, reporting telephone call received at his residence on September 9, 1963, from the Night Supervisor of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, San Francisco, advising that he had received a call from an anonymous person stating that Dwight Allen Wilson, an employee of Arrigoni, Rule and Associates, 2563 Prune Ridge, Santa Clara, California, was in the process of organizing an anti-Negro group of the Nazi type and that he had written a threatening letter to the President.

Further reference is made to Protective Research Referral Memorandum dated September 11, 1963, forwarding Office Memorandum dated September 10, 1963, from Special Agent Sherman of the White House Detail, reporting essentially the same information as received through the Federal Bureau of Investigation in San Francisco.

(B) GENERAL INQUIRIES:

On September 17, 1963, Mr. David Arrigoni, owner of Arrigoni, Rule and Associates, 2563 Prune Ridge, Santa Clara, California, was contacted by telephone and he advised that they had no employee by the name of Dwight Allen Wilson. Mr. Arrigoni stated that he had been personally interviewed

by Special Agent Malcolm Sample of the Federal Bureau of Investigation Office, San Jose.

On September 18, 1963, called at the Federal Bureau of Investigation, San Francisco, and interviewed Special Agent John McNamara. A check of their records disclosed two files, one on a Dwight Wilson and another on Dwight Allen Wilson (which contained the referenced correspondence). A report dated September 9, 1963, on Dwight Wilson disclosed that on August 30, 1963, a Mrs. Lynn Hernandez, 1467 Palmwood Drive, San Jose, reported that she had received information through a friend that a Dwight Wilson had indicated a great interest in the Nazi organization and when questioned by his fellow workers at the Aragon Engineering Company, 940 Shulman Street, Santa Clara, California, about registering with the Selective Service System he stated he had refused to do so.

On September 18, 1963, contacted Special Agent Malcolm E. Sample of the San Jose Federal Bureau of Investigation Office. He advised that he had made inquiry of the Retail Credit Bureau in San Jose which disclosed a record on a Dwight A. Wilson, 853 El Camino Real, Santa Clara, California, employed at the Aragon Engineering Company. Special Agent Sample stated that he interviewed Mr. H. C. Bechtle, President of the Aragon Engineering Company. Mr. Bechtle stated that Wilson had been in their employ since the Summer of 1961 as a handyman and delivery man. He stated that the personnel record of the subject was not available as it was in the hands of his accountant at the present time. He further stated that Wilson resided with his stepmother, Mrs. E. Comstock, at 853 El Camino Real, Santa Clara.

Mr. Bechtle stated that during the middle of July 1963 the subject went to Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and Houston, Texas, with his stepmother. On July 29, 1963, Mr. Bechtle received a long distance telephone call from Mrs. Comstock at Houston stating that Wilson was ill and in need of \$100. Mr. Bechtle asked her to have Wilson call him but he failed to do so. Mr. Bechtle learned that Wilson's stepmother had jumped bail on a drunken driving and driving without a license charge. He reported receiving the long distance telephone call to the authorities and Mrs. Comstock was apprehended and is presently confined to the Santa Clara County Jail at San Jose.

Mr. Bechtle stated that Wilson returned to work during the last week of August 1963 and after receiving his pay on Thursday, September 12, 1963, has not returned to work. Mr. Bechtle stated that he considers Wilson a

good worker and is well liked by him.

Special Agent Sample learned that Wilson, since his return from Texas, had been living with a co-worker and his wife, John and Joan Chupp, 1792 Eisenhower Drive, Santa Clara, California. Special Agent Sample is of the belief that it was Chupp who made the anonymous telephone call to the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

When interviewed by Special Agent Sample, Chupp stated that Wilson talked about Hitler and white supremacy and that he was starting an organization with the initials DAW. Chupp stated that he had seen a threatening letter, handwritten by Wilson on tablet paper, addressed to the President. Chupp stated that the last time he had seen Wilson was on September 12, 1963, when he had driven him to a hotel in downtown San Jose near the Mercury News, a San Jose newspaper. Special Agent Sample later learned from Mr. Bechtle that the subject had checked into a hotel on September 12, 1963, and had checked out on September 14, 1963.

Special Agent Sample learned that the whereabouts of Wilson's father is unknown; that he was adopted; that his stepfather remarried; and that his stepmother is Mrs. Edith Seitsinger, also known as Comstock, Santa Clara Police Department No. 631230, FBI No. 4361875, Social Security No. 555-10-8263.

Special Agent Sample furnished the following description of Wilson:

White, male, American, approximately 19 years of age, born Santa Cruz, California, 5-4, 160 pounds, light brown hair, crewcut - close cropped and gives the appearance of being bald, blue eyes, light complexion, stocky build, is interested in wrestling.

Special Agent Sample learned from Mr. Bechtle that Wilson does not own a car but does have a California Driver's license; further, that he does not possess a gun and has no knowledge of firearms.

On September 18, 1963, Mrs. Lynn Hernandez was interviewed at 1467 Palmwood Drive, San Jose. She stated that she became acquainted with Wilson through Mr. and Mrs. John Chupp and has only seen him three times. She

stated that Wilson's stepmother had requested psychiatric help for her son through the San Jose Police Department.

Mrs. Hernandez stated that Wilson appeared to be a very unhappy person; that he had expressed great hatred toward minority races, particularly the Negroes. She stated that he was very interested in the Nazi Party organization and is of the belief that this association gives him a sense of importance. Mrs. Hernandez stated that she had learned through Mrs. Chupp that Wilson had written a letter to the President expressing his hatred for minority groups and requesting that he take action. She further stated that Mrs. Chupp, after she had learned of the letter, requested that Wilson leave her home.

At 2:00 P.M., September 10, 1963, Special Agent William S. Asmus, FBI, Washington, DC, telephoned this office to relate information recently received from the San Francisco FBI Office.

On September 9, 1963, the San Francisco FBI office received an anonymous telephone call from a male who discussed certain facts about an organization he had been asked to join. The caller stated that he had become acquainted with a person named Dwight Allen Wilson, who is the leader of an organization called the BWB (Disposition and Rights of Whites) aka TWW (The White Resistance) and who is a great admirer of the Nazis and Adolph Hitler.

The caller stated that he had read literature of this organization and a letter supposedly written by Wilson and addressed to the President, a portion of which he quoted: "Someday I'll meet you, you'll know me well, believe me, if the government hasn't changed by then, I'll destroy it along with you."

Further conversation with the caller, stated Asmus, revealed that he and possibly Wilson are employed by the Argonne Rule and Associates Engineering Company, Santa Clara, California. Further information could not be obtained as the caller ended the conversation.

Special Agent Asmus stated that SAIC Tom Hanson, San Francisco Field Office, was advised of the above facts by the FBI on September 9, 1963.

The night supervisor of the FBI, San Francisco, telephoned me at my residence yesterday evening and informed that he had received a call from a man who refused to identify himself, who said that Dwight Allen Wilson, an employee of Arrigoni, Rule & Associates, 2363 Prune Ridge, Santa Clara, Cal., was in the process of organizing an anti-negro group of the Nazi type.

During the course of the conversation the man said that Wilson had written a letter to President Kennedy which appeared to contain a threatening statement. The sentence, as the man recalled, was along the following order:

"Someday I'll meet you and if the government hasn't changed by then I'll destroy it along with you."

The FBI Supervisor said that in his conversation with the man it could not be determined whether or not the letter had actually been mailed, as the informant indicated that he had seen a copy.

The Supervisor stated that the FBI would investigate the possibility that Wilson was actually involved in such a venture as organizing an anti-negro group and that this office would be kept informed.

Please advise if further attention should be given to this matter at this time.

Special Agent Sample stated that he had interviewed the subject's step-mother, Mrs. Edith Seitsinger, also known as Constock, at the Santa Clara County Jail, San Jose, who advised that she has no information as to the subject's whereabouts; further, that when the subject was a child a doctor had informed her that he had mental problems.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation in San Jose also ascertained that the subject checked into the Aconda Hotel, 141 Santa Clara Avenue, San Jose, on September 12, 1963, and that he had checked out on September 14, 1963; that he had left behind a tablet and a dictionary; that he registered under his own name. Special Agent Sample stated that he had again contacted Mr. and Mrs. John Chupp, 1792 Eisenhower Drive, Santa Clara, but they could

SYNOPSIS

Subject interviewed at Spokane on October 28 & 29;

(A) INTRODUCTION:

Case originated October 26 when Thomas Colarelli, FBI Agent, Spokane, informed me by telephone that the suspect was in Spokane and was wanted for questioning by our San Francisco office regarding an alleged threat against the President; that our San Francisco office had been advised. He also stated A/IC Lloyd E. Brown, Jr., Air Force Recruiting Office, Bon Marche Building, Spokane, could furnish additional information regarding the subject.

(B) GENERAL INQUIRIES:

A/IC Lloyd E. Brown, Jr. was interviewed on Saturday, October 26, at his residence, 1923 West College, Spokane, Washington. He stated the subject had applied for recruitment in the Air Force and during their verification of his date and place of birth the subject's stepmother, Edith Seitsinger, was located in the county jail, San Jose, California. Mrs. Seitsinger had stated the subject was wanted by the FBI for making a threat against the President. A/IC Brown stated the subject had passed the physical and written tests for the Air Force and as soon as his birth had been verified the subject would be eligible for recruitment. He said the subject's grade on the written test was slightly above average. He also stated that as soon as our investigation had been completed, the subject would be given further consideration for recruitment providing he was not arrested. He said the Air Force had arranged accommodations for the subject at the Coeur d'Alene Hotel in Spokane and that the subject would return to his office on Monday morning, October 28.

(C) PERSONAL INTERVIEW

On October 28, 1963 Lloyd John Wilson was located in the Air Force Recruiting Office at Spokane and he accompanied me to our office where he was interviewed. The subject is single and is described as follows: American; male; white; 18 years of age; born August 16, 1945 at Santa Cruz, California; 5 feet 8 inches; 160 pounds; stocky build; blue eyes; light brown hair worn in crew cut; light complexion; red birth mark the size of a dime on right upper arm; fairly neat in appearance, wearing sport coat and slacks.

The subject stated he is an American citizen, that he was an orphan, and that his name by birth was John Allen Wilson and his true parents are unknown to him. The Air Force recruiting office in Spokane subsequently advised me they had verified the subject's date of birth and that his true name is Lloyd John Wilson, and he was recruited under this name in the Air Force. The subject stated his stepfather, Elmer Seitsinger, is deceased and that his stepmother, Edith Seitsinger, is in the county jail, San Jose, California; that he has no brothers or sisters. He said he had been adopted twice and had used the adopted names of Dwight Allen Wilson and Lloyd Long.

The subject acknowledged that during the latter part of August and the first part of September 1963 at San Jose, California he had prepared notes for an organization to be known as "T.E.", representing "The White Resistance" for the suppression of what he believed to be "an upcoming Negro revolution." He stated that among his notes was a letter he had composed for the President and that he had never mailed this letter. He wrote this letter in longhand from memory and it contains the following excerpt: "One day Mr. President we'll meet face to face and if the government and you haven't changed to my way of thinking then I'll destroy you as well as the government for I have no feelings whatsoever for anyone who doesn't think the same as I do." The subject explained that he meant he would "destroy" the President politically by infiltration in the government with his organization and by "brain washing." He said he left his notes regarding this organization at a hotel, name not recalled, located in Santa Clara, California, when he checked out of this hotel about September 14, 1963.

I telephoned SAIC Hanson, San Francisco, for additional details and was advised that the subject had a room at the Acanda Hotel, 141 West Santa Clara, San Jose, California; that only a few scribbled notes by the subject of no importance were found in his room. SAIC Hanson stated their file disclosed some persons interviewed had referred to the subject as a "nut" and that the file was being airmailed to Spokane.

The subject was reinterviewed October 29, 1963 in the Spokane office after the San Francisco file was received. A two-page statement was obtained from the subject and the case was discussed in detail with Assistant U. S. Attorney Carroll D. Gray, Spokane. Mr. Gray then questioned the subject in my presence,

and at the conclusion he declines prosecution. During this interview the subject stated he had completely eliminated any future thought of forming his proposed T.M. Organization; that he was trying to forget all about it. He expressed a great desire to be accepted in the Air Force on a four-year enlistment and to complete his education and make a career in the Air Force.

(D) CURRENT MENTAL CONDITION

The subject displayed some emotional reaction of aggressiveness. It is the opinion of Assistant U. S. Attorney Gray and myself that the subject is in need of psychiatric treatment. The subject stated he had never been hospitalized for any physical or mental reason. The subject also stated he had never been arrested.

(E) FAMILY BACKGROUND:

Elmer Seitsinger, stepfather, deceased; Edith Seitsinger, stepmother, 853 El Camino, Santa Clara, California. Relatives through stepmother; Mrs. Gertrude Latta, aunt, Tarawa Avenue, Houston, Texas; David Gallagher, uncle, 1211 Taft Street, Lawton, Oklahoma.

(F) PREVIOUS ACTIVITIES OR HISTORY:

Education: Completed ninth grade at Washington Junior High School, Salinas, California.

Employment: One week, October 14-22, 1963, Yakima Fruit & Cold Storage Company, Yakima, Washington, as a laborer. January 1962 to September 13, 1963, Aragon Engineering Company, 940 Shulman Avenue, Santa Clara, California, as a machinist helper. 1958 to January 1962, Gill Lemas, Taco Service Station, Casterville, California, part-time work as a service station attendant.

Military Record: Enlisted October 31, 1963 at Spokane in the U. S. Air Force and transferred November 2, 1963 to Lackland Air Force Base, Texas.

The subject expressed no desire to visit the President. The subject can not use a typewriter and has no machine available.

The subject furnished specimens of his handwriting and handprinting.

(G) PROTECTIVE INFORMATION:

The subject has had very little experience with firearms and he said the only gun he possessed was a rifle which he sold about three years ago. He said he had owned this gun about one year and had used it a few times for hunting. He stated he had no other experience with firearms and no experience with explosives.

The subject displayed no animosity toward the President. He said he agrees with some of the things the President has done and disagrees with others; that he "does not have any intention of going against the President."

The subject has shown an interest in the American Nazi Party. However, he stated he had never been a member of this party and had never contacted any of the members, although he had read some of their literature. He stated he is very much against communism.

(H) MEANS OF SOLUTION:

The subject's address in Spokane was obtained from an FBI agent. Assistant U. S. Attorney Carroll Gray, Spokane, declined prosecution and the subject returned to the Air Force recruiting office in Spokane. A/IC Lloyd E. Brown, Jr., Air Force recruiting office, was advised as to the purpose of our interview with the subject and he was permitted to read the subject's statement dated October 29, 1963. A/IC Brown advised me on November 6, 1963 that the subject had been accepted in the Air Force on October 31 and that he had been transferred to Lackland Air Force Base, Texas.

(J) CIRCULASION:

Two polaroid pictures of the subject were taken in the Spokane office. One picture is transmitted with the original of this report and one is attached for San Francisco. Handwriting and handprinting specimens were obtained and they are transmitted with the original of this report. A verifax copy of the subject's unmailed letter written from memory on October 26 in the Spokane office is attached for San Francisco.

Form 1639 has been executed and one copy is transmitted with the original of this report and one copy is enclosed for San Francisco.

The original statement sworn to by the subject October 29, 1963 is enclosed for the Chief and a copy of this statement is attached for San Francisco.

In view of the subject's questionable mental condition, the subject should be considered dangerous.

I, JOHN A. WILSON, aka Dwight Allen Wilson, age 18, being first duly sworn under oath, have been advised that I do not have to make any statement, that any statement I make can be used against me, and that I may have an attorney present before making a statement; but in order that the truth may be known, I hereby make the following statement of my own free will and no threats or promises have been made to me.

While in San Jose, California during September 1963, I read a magazine entitled "Oce." This magazine offered one million dollars to anyone who would assassinate Fidel Castro. There was a cover picture of Castro on the magazine. I read a story in this magazine entitled "The Upcoming Negro Revolution." I was staying with a friend of mine, John Chupp, on Eisenhower Drive, Agnew, California. I asked Mr. Chupp to read this magazine, and after reading it he agreed with my ideas to form an organization of white people against the Negro leaders, such as Malcolm X, leader of the Black Muslim Organization.

I bought a notebook the next day and started jotting down my ideas of what I was going to write and how the organization was to be formed. I had an outline of the cards I was going to have printed for the organization which was to be called "DW", representing my initials. This organization was also to be called the TWR, representing "The White Resistance." I made notes of several things I was going to have changed in the United States once my organization gained control. The changes included complete control of all publications, no visitors to the United States, close control over imports and exports, and anyone who did not conform to the new government formed by my organization would be deported or assassinated.

I talked to all the employees at the Arsgone Engineering Company in Santa Clara, California and tried to get them interested in my organization. Out of the fifteen employees, three or four of the men agreed with me.

I planned to have posters, cards, and literature printed for the organization but I did not have money for this purpose and I discontinued further activity regarding the organization after about two weeks.

Included in my notes concerning the organization, of which I subsequently lost, was an outline of a letter to the President of the United States. On October 28, 1963, I wrote this letter from memory in the Secret Service office at Spokane, Washington. The letter was intended for President John F. Kennedy, Washington, D. C., and stated in part: "One day, Mr. President, we'll meet face to face, and if the government and you haven't changed to my way of thinking, then I'll destroy you as well as the government for I have no feeling whatsoever for anyone who doesn't think the same as I do." I intended this statement to mean that by the time I was powerful enough to gain control of the United States by infiltration and

brainwashing that there would probably be a different president and his ideas would possibly be the same as mine. If his ideas were not the same as mine, I would have to depend on the cabinet members in my organization to change his mind. If the President did not change his mind to agree with our ideas, it would be necessary for me to have the President of the United States assassinated.

I never knew any member of the Nazi Party, but I planned to locate some of them for financial backing and advice. At the present time I am trying to forget all about this organization and I do not have any intention to try and form this organization in the future.

I obtained my ideas for the DAN and TWR Organization from reading Nazi literature. I am completely against communism. I am completely against any type of violence and bloodshed, although it is possible that much killing would occur in order for my organization to obtain power, once I did obtain such power there would be no future violence and the United States would be a country of peace and happiness.

The above statement has been read by me and I understand it and have been permitted to make corrections.

Our Spokane office advised that the subject has been accepted in the U.S. Air Force, Serial No. AF 19777251, and has been transferred to Lackland Air Force Base, Texas.
