Pelican Cup

The Entrepreneurship Pelican Cup is a real-world entrepreneur education opportunity for college students. Whether they are serious about launching a startup, or they want to learn more about entrepreneurship, competitors will gain a greater appreciation of the challenges and opportunities of starting a viable business. Competitors have access to networks of entrepreneurs, economic developers, investors, and others as they move through the process. The rigor of the competition sharpens their critical thinking, teambuilding, presentation, and other soft skills – all important to career success. The Entrepreneurship Pelican Cup offers one of the largest all-cash prize pools of any collegiate business competition in the country. The 2024 cash prize pool is \$96,000, thanks to the generosity and partnership of Sponsor Dhu C. Thompson, founder and retired CEO of Delta Plastics.



College Symposium

The College of Business and Social Sciences Symposium hosted its annual college symposium through September 30 - October 3, 2024. The theme for 2024 is "EveryONE Has a Story." The event featured keynote speaker Ryan Campbell, a career fair, a cookout, the annual CBSS Brain Bowl, and alumni speaker sessions covering a wide range of topics. Campbell is known as the youngest solo pilot to fly around the world and was named one of Australia's 50 great explorers. "We consider the annual symposium our premiere student-focused event where faculty, staff, alumni, community members, and professionals from across the country come to present their journey. The value this brings to our students' professional growth and development cannot be measured," said Cathi Hemed, Director of External Initiatives for the College of Business and Social Sciences.

ULM CBSS receives \$1.5 million Department of Labor grant to continue High School Business Academy

ULM's growth as a program has been based on the generosity of private donors. ULM was able to obtain a courtroom bench from the Ouachita Parish Police Jury during the 2013-14 season The courtroom was moved to Strauss Hall Room 148, a spacious auditorium seating 100. It was christened with the 1st Annual ULM Mock Trial tournament, with a ULM Maroon Team win over Tulane University. Honoring ULM was E. Orum Young, an attorney practicing in Monroe, Louisiana who made a substantial donation that will continue for a five year period. The courtroom was named in his honor.

High School Business Academy

The College of Business and Social Sciences at the University of Louisiana Monroe held a press conference on Tuesday, October 3, 2023, to announce the receipt of a second consecutive Department of Labor WORC Delta Regional Authority grant to fund the High School Business Academy. The grant award totals \$1,499,983 and will continue to fund the program for the next three years. The High School Business Academy covers 11 parishes and prepares high school students for in-demand jobs in their communities in Northeast Louisiana.

"The High School Business Academy is a program in which ULM business faculty have created business-related courses and provide trainings to area high school teachers," said program coordinator Kelli Cole. "The high school teachers are given all necessary information and materials to teach the courses."

The University of Louisiana Monroe (ULM) is a comprehensive, state-funded institution of higher education that offers high-quality educational and experiential opportunities to meet the academic, cultural, vocational, social, and personal needs of undergraduate, graduate, and continuing education students. ULM's mission is to "seek students who find value in our programs and prepare them to compete, succeed, and contribute in an ever-changing global society through a transformative education."

Today, ULM has an annual enrollment of over 8,200 students and has awarded a combined total of over 72,000 academic degrees to more than 65,000 alumni. Founded in 1931, ULM's campus — one of the state's most attractive with beautiful Bayou DeSiard flowing through its 238-acre, tree-shaded campus — is located in the eastern part of Monroe. Together with its sister city of West Monroe, these communities comprise a metropolitan area of nearly 202,000 residents serve as the commercial, medical, and cultural hub for the northeast Louisiana region. The Twin Cities of Monroe and West Monroe straddle the Ouachita River, which many feel is one of the nation's most beautiful rivers.



Northeast Louisiana Business and Industry Profile

The Northeast Louisiana area is home to a diverse group of industries, businesses, and governmental agencies that partner with the College of Business and Social Sciences to fill their talent needs. Northeast Louisiana has a vibrant and diverse economy that is rapidly transitioning. While once dominated by agriculture, Monroe is now home to the global headquarters of Lumen, a US technology and telecom company, and the US headquarters of Drax, Inc., an international producer of biofuels. Several large corporations, including Amazon and Microsoft, have recently made significant investments in the region to support clean energy production.

Ouachita Parish is the healthcare hub of Northeastern Louisiana, and it is home to two private hospitals and an academic teaching hospital. The State of Louisiana has significant regional governmental offices in Monroe that often employ the College's graduates.

The region is home to significant manufacturing facilities. Louisiana Plastics Industries, Graphic Packaging, and Advancion have extensive manufacturing facilities in Ouachita Parish. In the surrounding parishes, Midsouth Extrusion, the Kennedy Companies, Lamb Weston, and Foster Farms have large operations that contribute significantly to the local economy.

The area is home to a tremendous entrepreneurial spirit. Many companies, including Scott Powerlines Equipment, Louisiana Plastics, and the Kennedy Companies, among many others, began in the region and have tremendously impacted the local economy and the College. The business community's willingness to support the College of Business and Social Sciences is one of the College's greatest assets.









The Monroe Area

The City of Monroe is a unique and historic city on the banks of the Ouachita River in Northeast Louisiana. Its citizens epitomize southern charm. With their friendliness and quick wit they help to make the place irresistible. Its natural beauty - that of the Ouachita River, Bayou DeSiard and Black Bayou Lake in particular – contributes to this irresistibility. Like many cities in the South and all over the United States, Monroe has a wonderful and rich history with legacies of booming economies fueled by - in Monroe's case - cotton, paper manufacturing, Coca-Cola bottling, railroads and the manufacture of carbon black from the area's natural gas wells, followed in subsequent years by the finance, health care, education and government sectors.


