VOA Opens New Family Shelter in Monroe County



Volunteers of America is proud to announce the recent opening of our newest family shelter, "Moving Forward." VOA has partnered with Monroe County to create a new shelter with 58 private units to address the growing number of unhoused families in the Rochester area as a way to keep families together during a time of crisis. This shelter will serve families of any composition, a model VOA introduced with our first shelter, The Guest House, which opened in 2008 with 14 private units. In addition to safe shelter, Moving Forward will provide families with meals, transportation, and on-site support services that will assist them with finding permanent housing, connecting with health care, and securing income. These services are currently unavailable to the many families placed in hotels with nowhere else to go.

"Moving Forward" will be the largest family shelter in Monroe County, with the ability to serve 58 families at any given time.

"The affordable housing crisis impacts too many Monroe County families," said County Executive Adam Bello. "Thank you to DHS Commissioner Thalia Wright and her team, our county legislature for their support, and our partners at Volunteers of America for their dedicated work to ensure our families have a safe place to stay and to access the resources families need."

VOA's Moving Forward family shelter will significantly expand assistance to those families like Monica's, who came to VOA's Guest House shelter when the house they were renting for years was sold and they were forced out by the new owners. Suddenly homeless and struggling to find affordable housing

for their family of five, Monica was referred to VOA. The VOA team was able to get Monica and her family moved into our Guest House shelter, where our staff provided temporary housing and assistance in finding a new place to live. Within a few weeks, VOA identified an available apartment and assisted the family in transitioning... (continue on page 4)





Annual Gala Helps Raise Essential Funds

In a powerful community gathering on April 18, Volunteers of America hosted its 4th Annual Gala at The Arbor Loft, raising \$115,000 for our programs that address the issue of homelessness, enhance childhood education, and combat poverty in the Rochester area.

Dr. Junior Dillion, President and CEO of VOA Upstate New York, shared the stage with notable speakers including, Mayor Malik Evans and presenting sponsor Bank of America's Rochester President Colleen Matteson. Dr. Dillion emphasized the collective effort needed to advance VOA's mission, highlighting the organization's success in serving more than 5,000 individuals annually.

"Here at VOA, we are more than just a service provider; we're a community built on compassion," said Dillion. "We create environments where children thrive, where parents find peace of mind, and where individuals find the courage to ask for help without fear of judgment."

Tiffany, a current staff member who previously benefited from the VOA Children's Center as a parent, also shared her personal story highlighting the comprehensive support she received when she was struggling to find housing and employment, seeking a new start for herself and her children.

"If you had asked me 7 years ago what my plans for the future were, it most definitely wouldn't have included a night like tonight," Tiffany reflected. "My response might have been just to survive my day. I have been able to achieve some of the greatest accomplishments in my life thanks to people who support organizations like Volunteers of America. I went from being a WEP worker, dependent on the social services system, staying in a homeless shelter, jobless, hopeless, on the brink of giving up to working for an organization that has remained true to their mission — a hand-up, not a handout."

For more than 35 years, VOA has worked with local senior living communities to identify older women who have outlived their families or are separated from them and recognize these women with gifts of appreciation for Mother's Day. This year, VOA distributed more than 200 gift baskets filled with flowers, treats, and other gifts for the residents and clients at Catholic Charities, Cobblestone Place, Danforth Towers Apartments, Hudson Ridge, Jonathan Child Apartments, Jordan Health, and Montgomery Neighborhood Center.

According to the Administration on Aging, approximately 27% of older adults in the United States live alone, and older women are often at a higher risk of social isolation, which leaves them vulnerable to increased mental and physical health problems. On Mother's Day, the feeling of loneliness can be heightened for those women who find themselves forgotten on this special day.

Berta hasn't seen family in three years. "I miss them, and it would be good to see them. They know that if I could get there, I would," she says of her three daughters, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren who live in Texas. Berta says having VOA deliver gift bags to women on Mother's Day is amazing, "maybe your kids are a thousand miles away, but someone always remembers you. That's a blessing."

and children aged 3 and 4, as well as after-school programs for children aged 5-12.

According to the NYS Office of Children and Family Services, more than 60% of New York State is classified as a child care desert, meaning there are not enough licensed child care spots to accommodate the number of children in those areas. This shortage places a heavy burden on working families.

Limited access to child care can hinder a child's school readiness and overall development. The Children's Center is committed to bridging this gap. Quality early childhood education is essential for fostering social, emotional, and cognitive skills.
