Implementation Status and Key Decisions

Despite the risks of India's absence in the regional operation and implementation delays, some progress in meeting the PDO is being made. The development of a sustainable regional mechanism for addressing wildlife protection and conservation is being pursued through: (i) India's signature of bilateral Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) with Bangladesh, Bhutan and Nepal on cross-border cooperation; (ii) Bangladesh's decision under APL 1 to assume the leadership for regional collaboration in trans-boundary wildlife protection by convening thematic meetings among the countries in the region; (iii) establishment of the Secretariat for the South Asia Wildlife Enforcement Network (SAWEN) and endorsement of the SAWEN statute by the member countries during the Second SAWEN meeting in August 2014; and (iv) institutional capacity building for the SAWEN Secretariat under the Nepal project (APL 1) as well as a Bank-supported Institutional Development Fund (IDF) grant. Also, the enforcement agencies were strengthened in each participating country and the APL program is supporting collaboration among them. Finally, trans-boundary human wildlife conflict management initiatives are ongoing in all three APL participating countries.

Progress toward the achievement of the PDO remains moderately unsatisfactory because the national ratification of the statute for SAWEN (envisaged to be the regional mechanism for collaboration on addressing wildlife crime and protection threats) by each member country has not been completed. Also, the implementation delays of the project in Bangladesh that are critical to meeting the PDO have not been fully addressed.

BANGLADESH: Implementation progress is rated as moderately unsatisfactory largely because of the delays with the creation of cadre positions and retention of the staff for the Wildlife Circle and issues with the oversight and management of the project, including procurement. On the other hand, progress is being made with the sub-projects under Component 2.2 that began implementation in late 2013. However, disbursements currently amount to 35% of the IDA credit.

NEPAL: Implementation improved since the mid-term review in May 2014 as efforts were made to eliminate the impediments faced by the project coordination unit (PCU) from the management of the National Trust for Nature Conservation (NTNC) where the PCU is located. The Departments of National Parks and Wildlife Conservation and of Forests made some improvements to the monitoring of sub-project activities and maintenance of investments carried out at the field level. Disbursements presently stand at 59% of the IDA grant.

OVERALL: Although implementation progress is rated as moderately satisfactory for Nepal, the considerably larger project cost and IDA credit for Bangladesh have led to a moderately unsatisfactory rating for the project (i.e., APL 1). Discussions on the possible revisions of the results framework took place during the MTR in Bangladesh, Bhutan and Nepal. The extent of the changes to the project activities will depend upon the achievement of the steps in the respective action plans. The changes will have to be documented through a formal project restructuring and the amendment of legal documents on the Bank's side as well as revisions of appropriate documents/programs on the Government's side.


